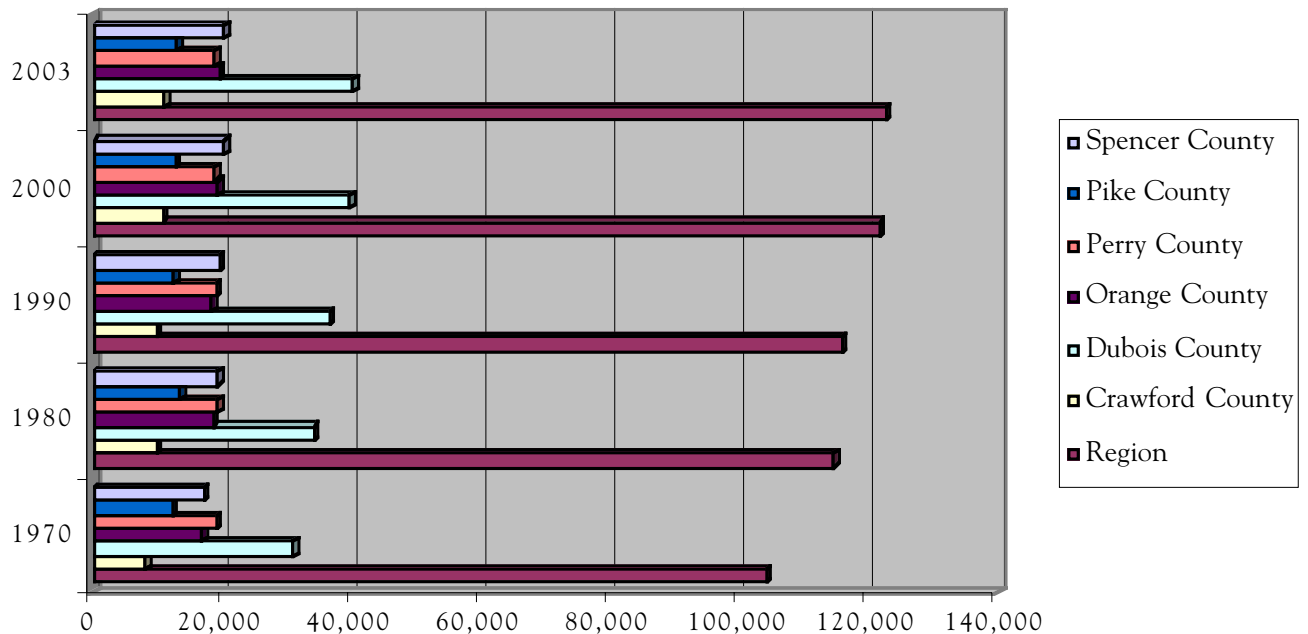

Six-County Population History



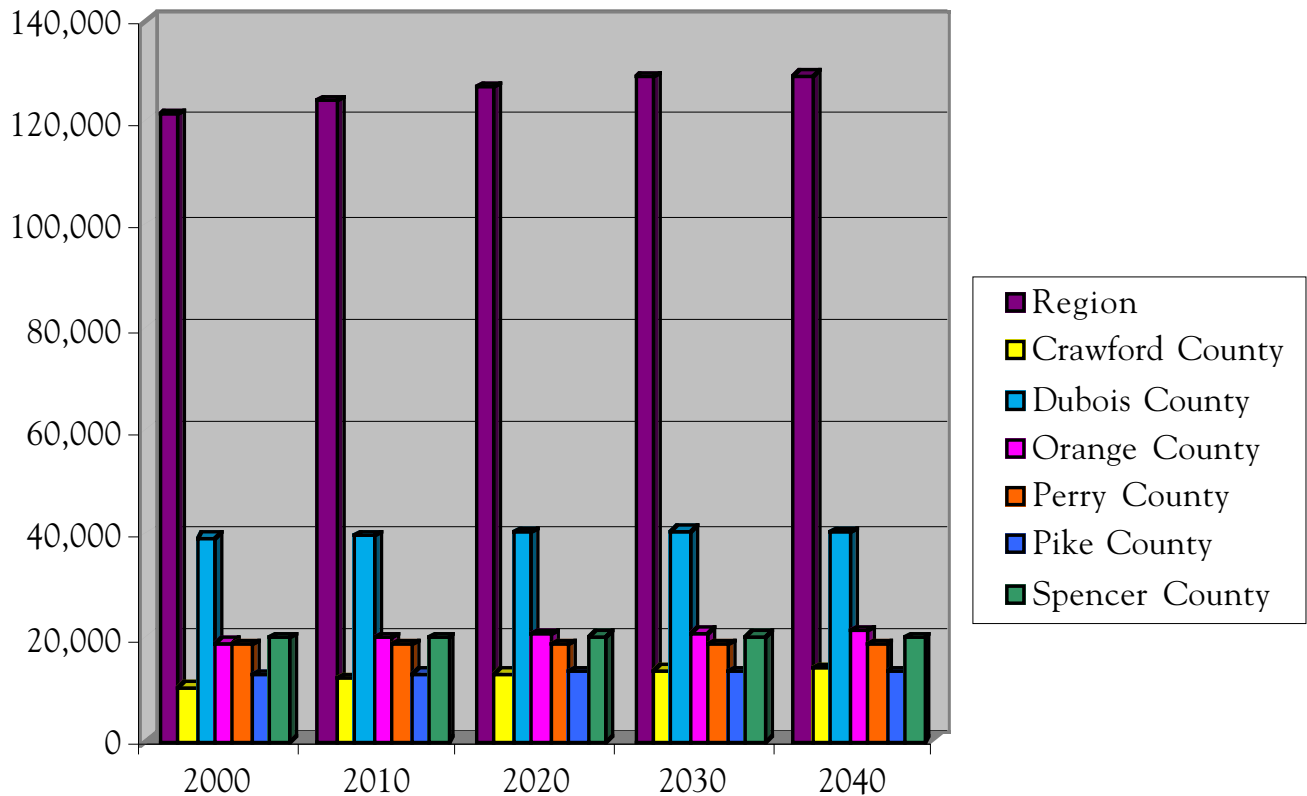

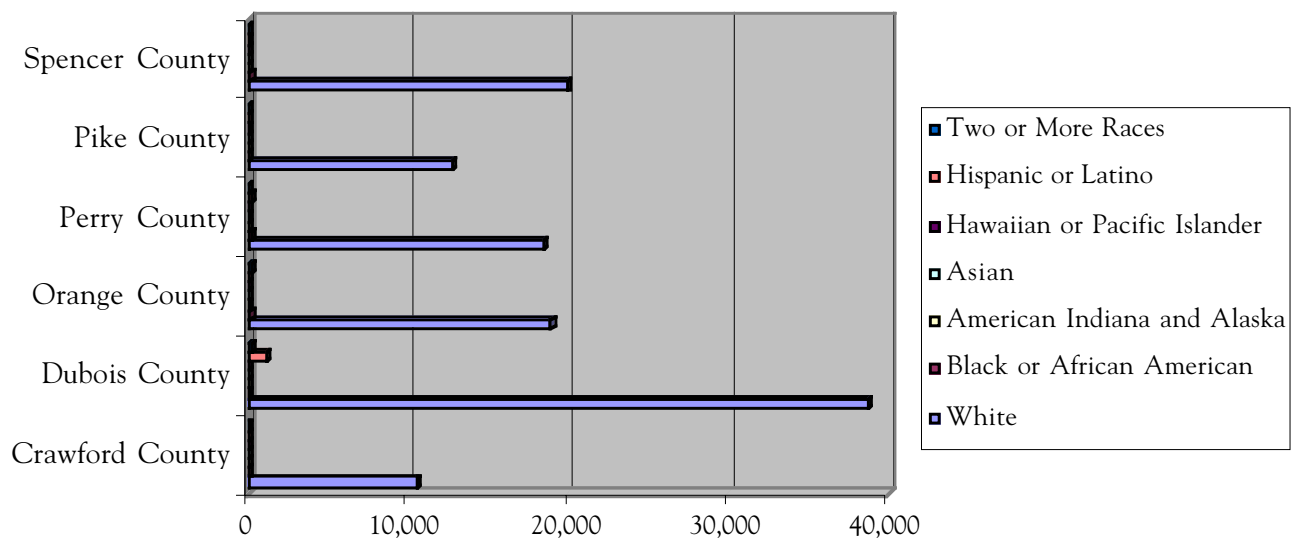

Population by Race



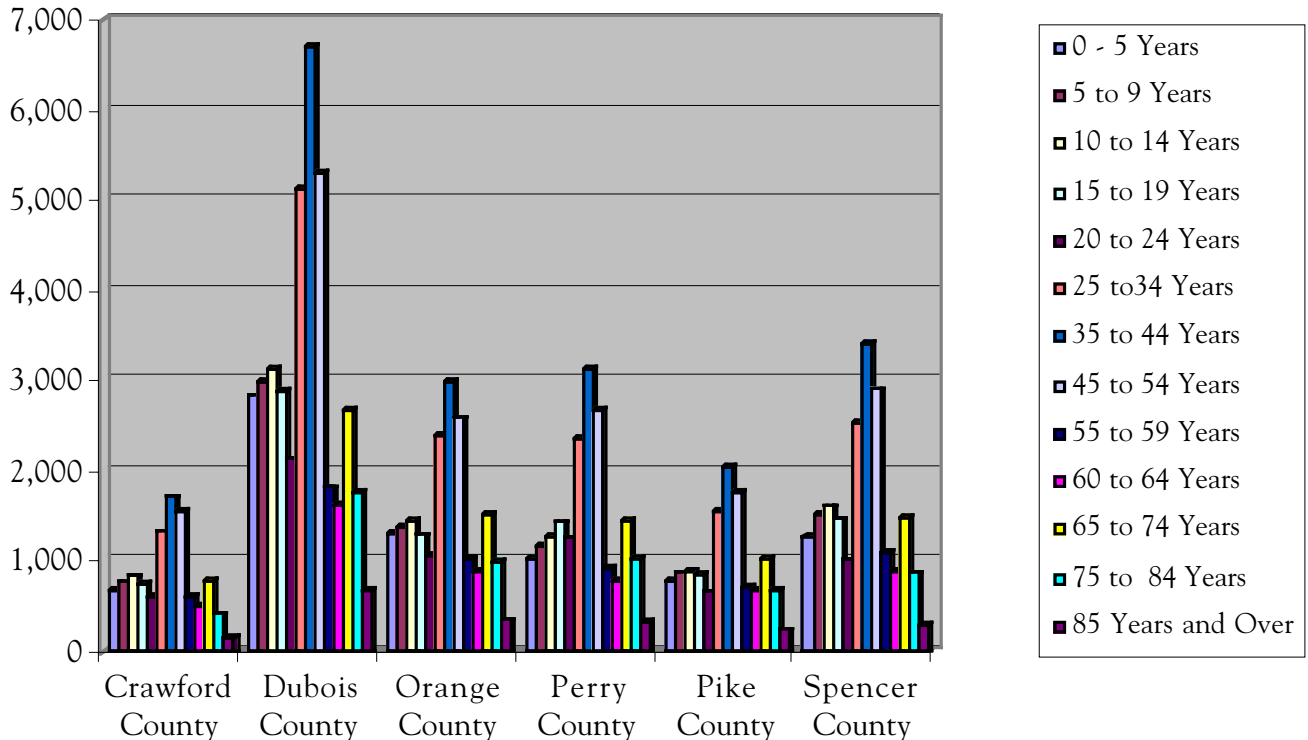

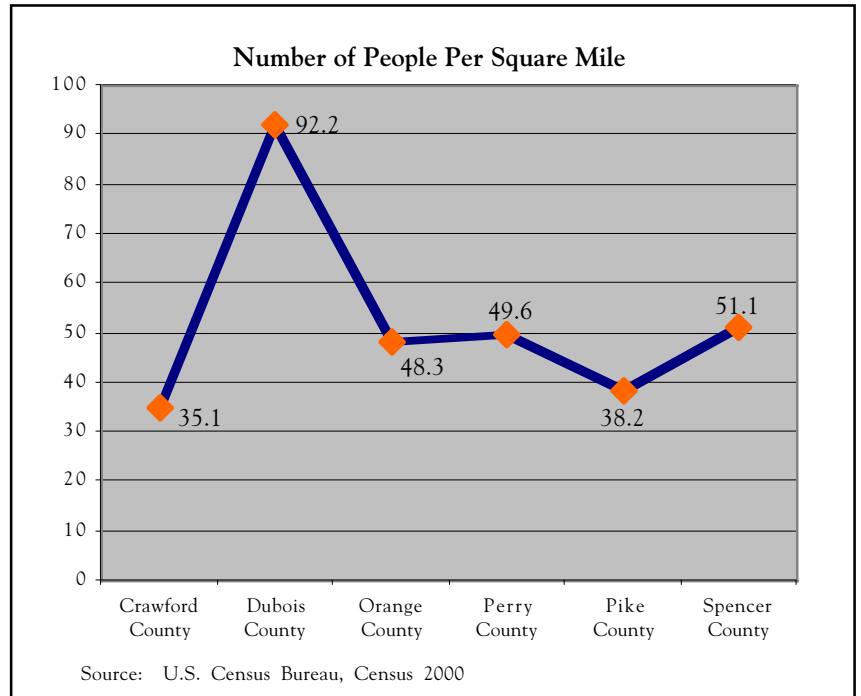

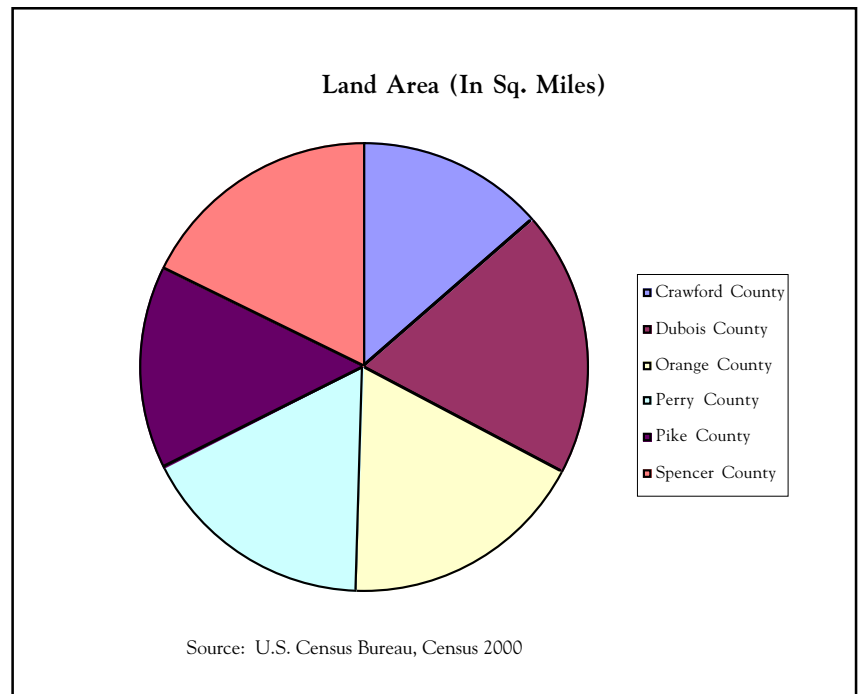

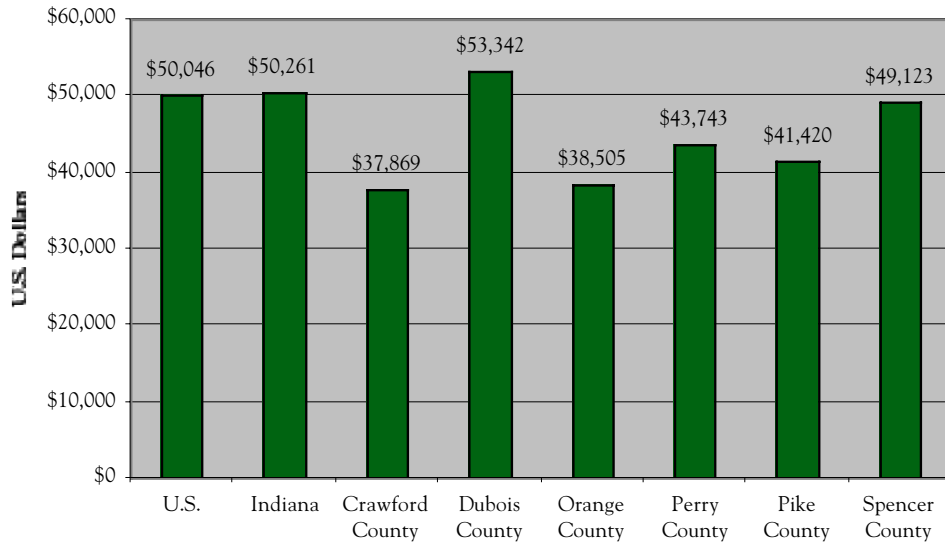

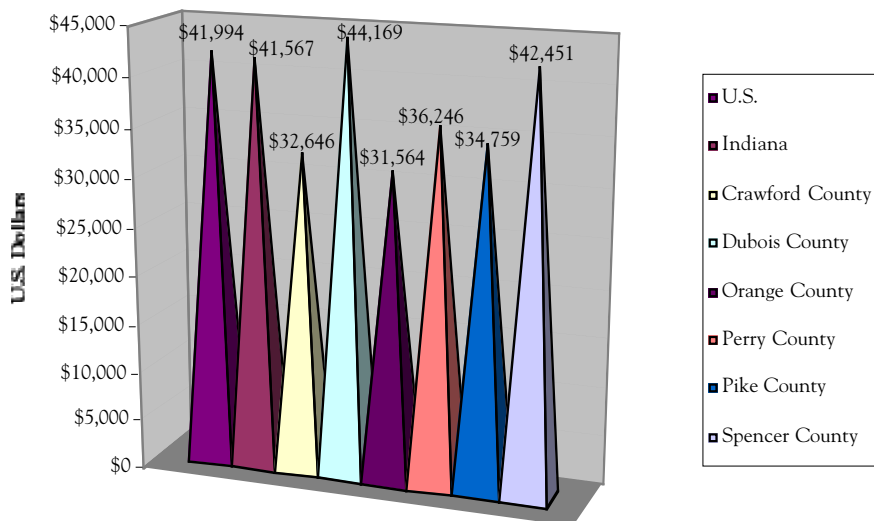

Median Household Income



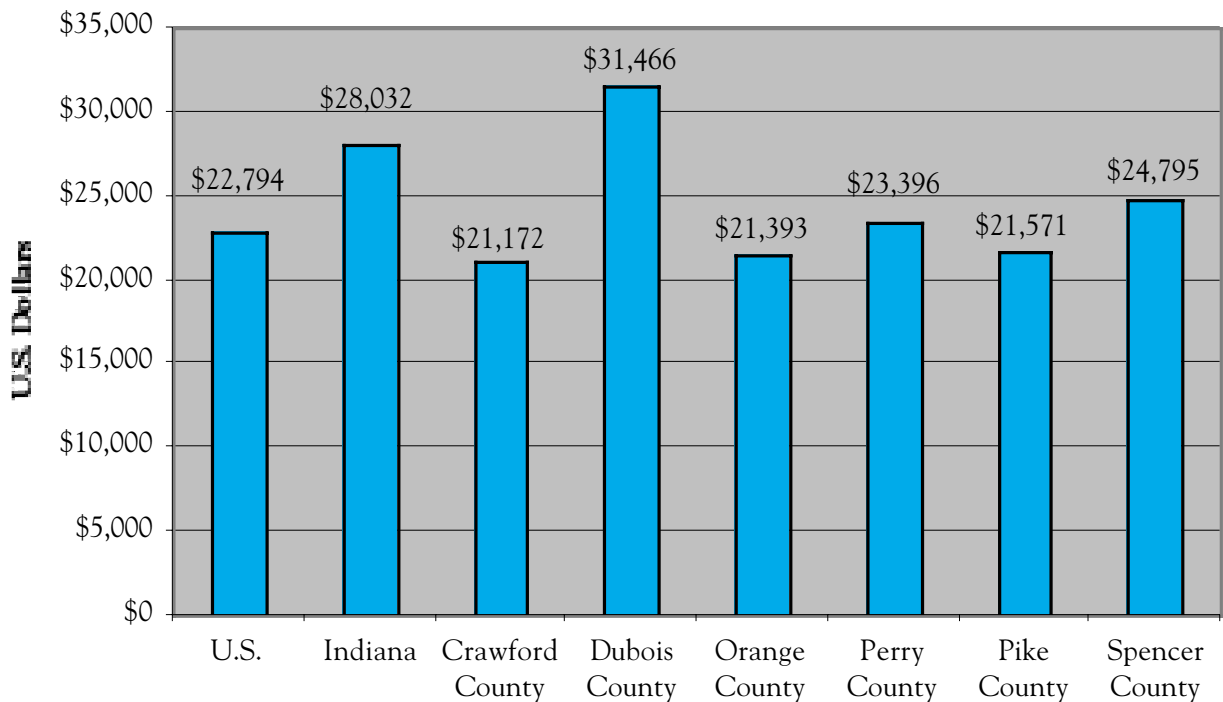

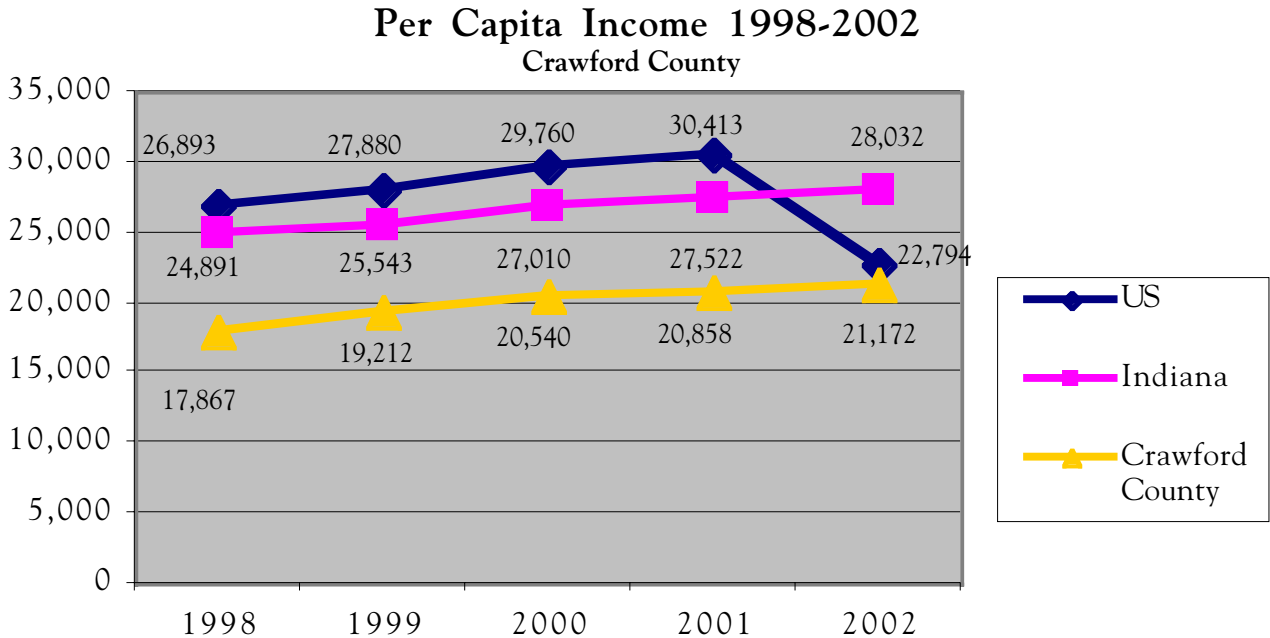
Per Capita Income for 2002



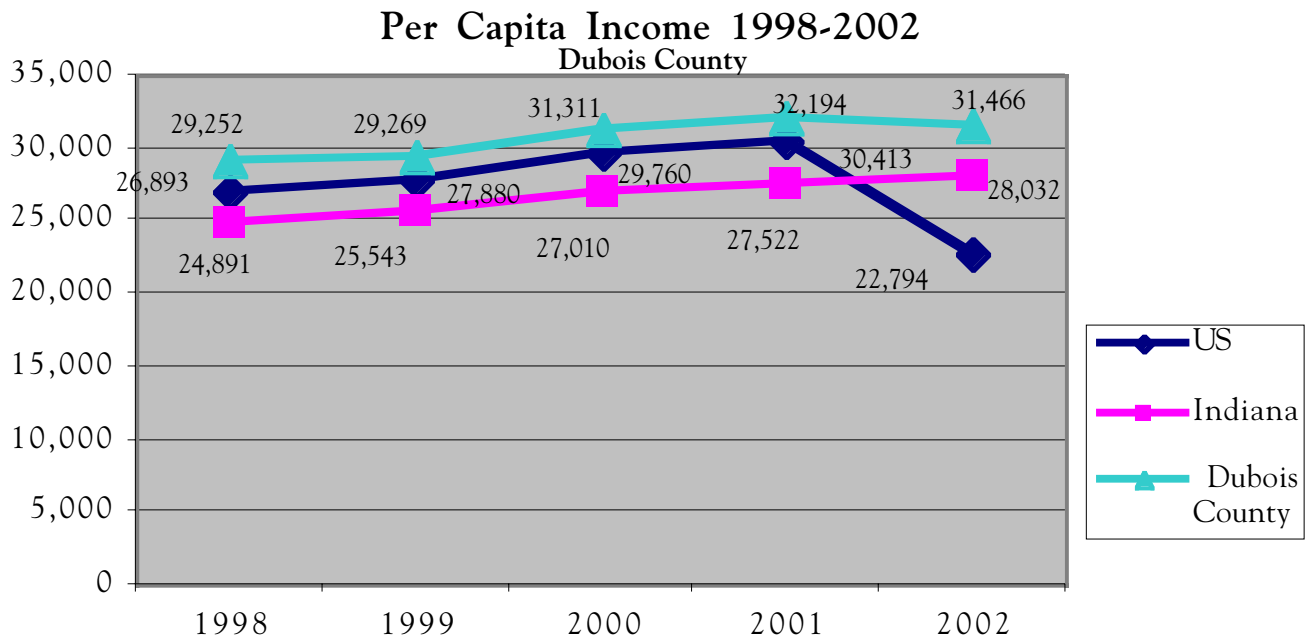

Per Capita Income 1998-2002



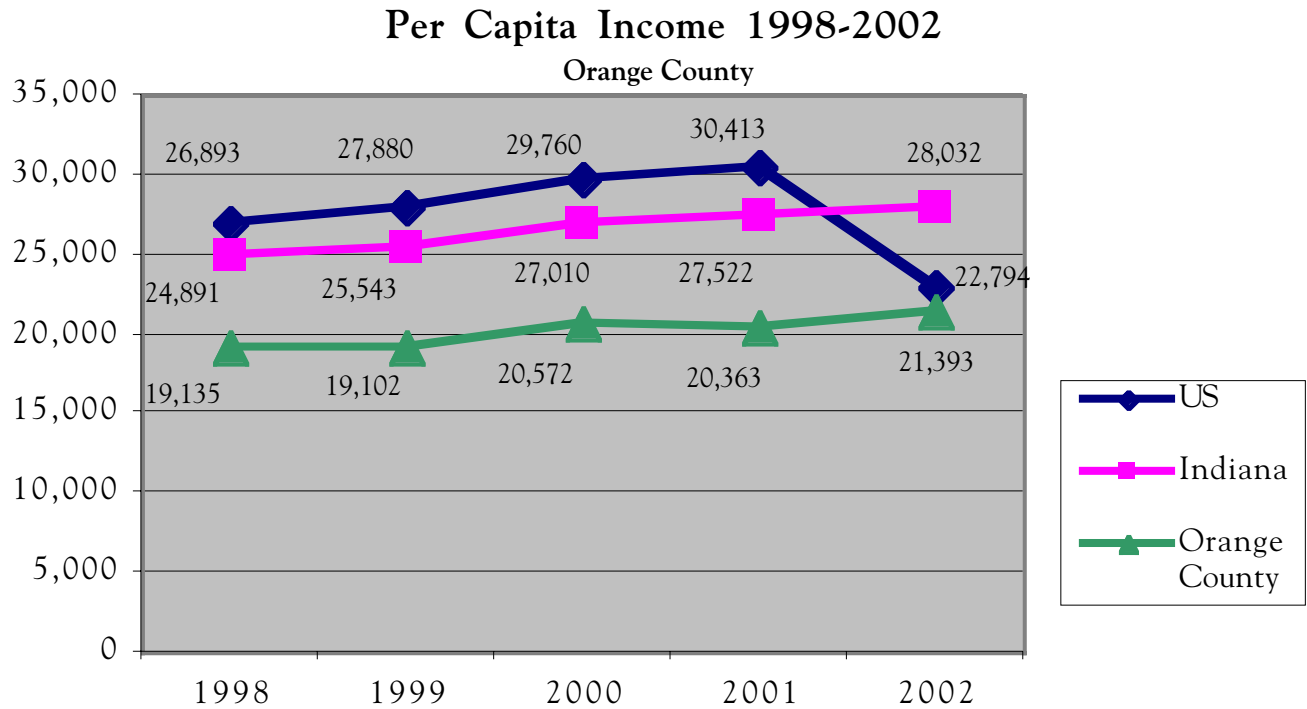

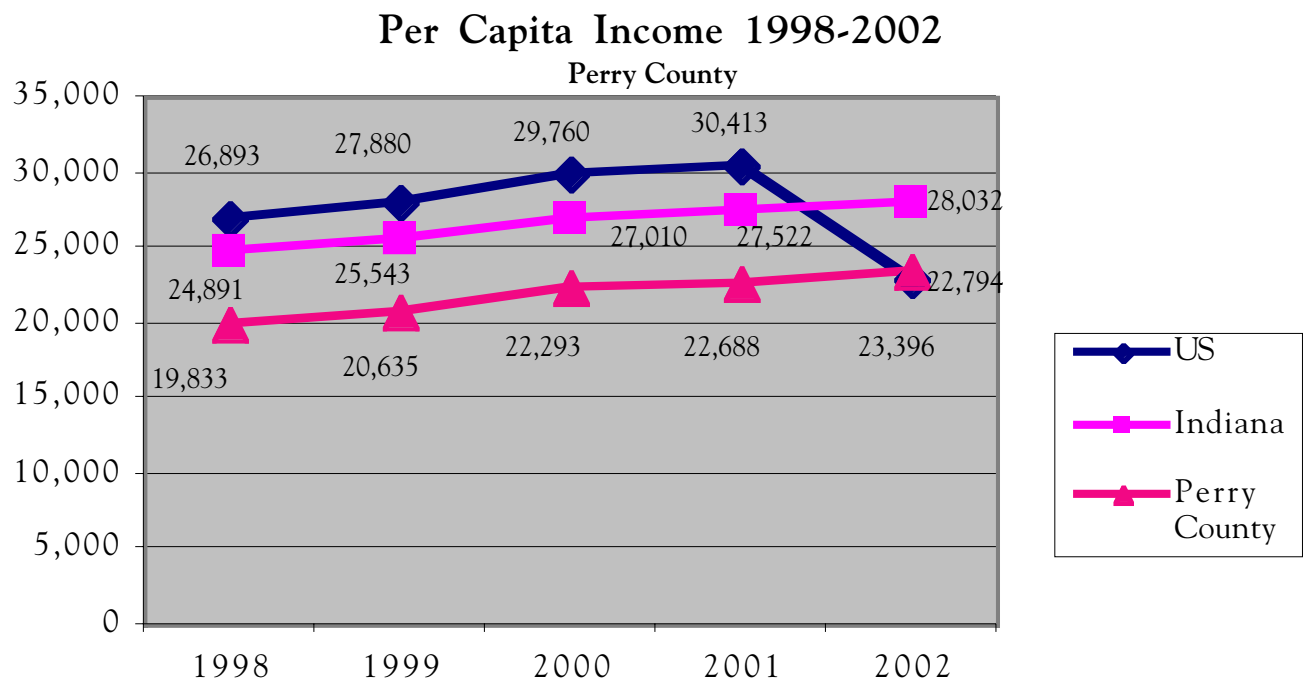

Per Capita Income 1998-2002



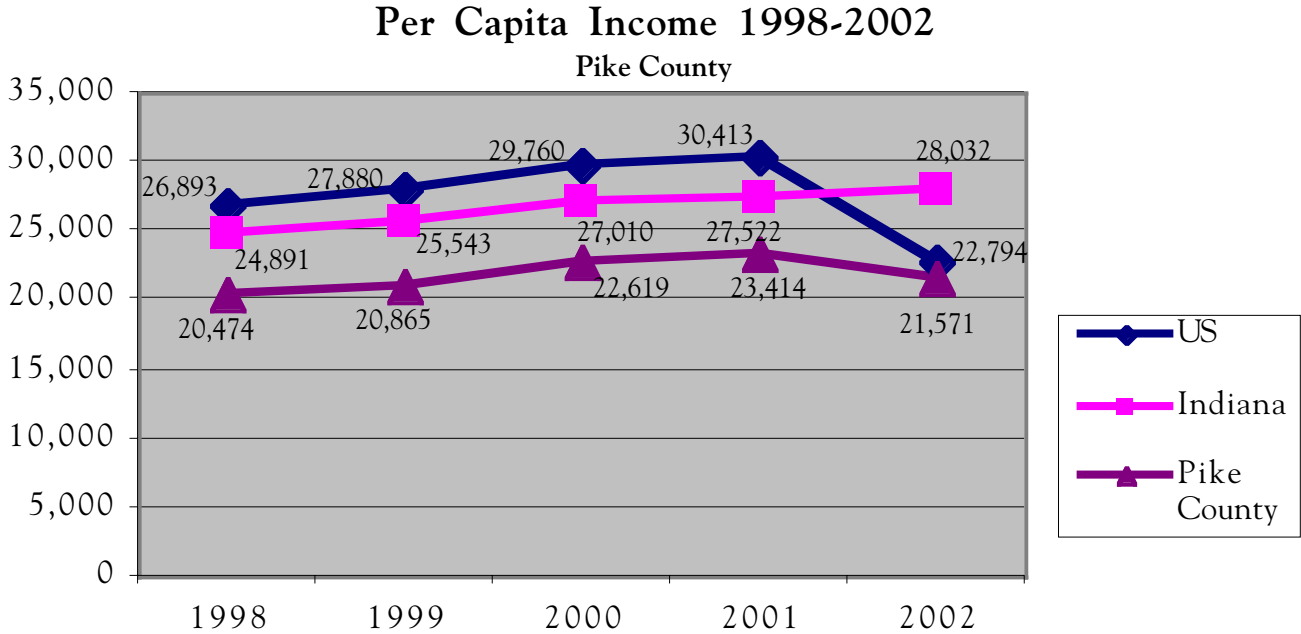

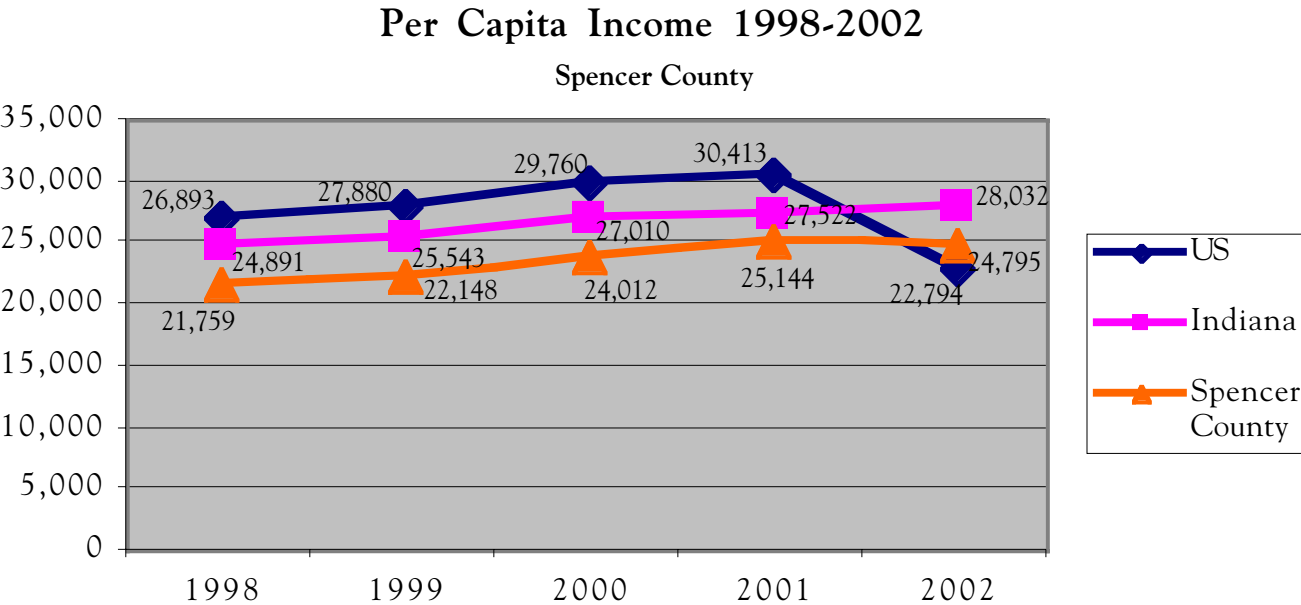

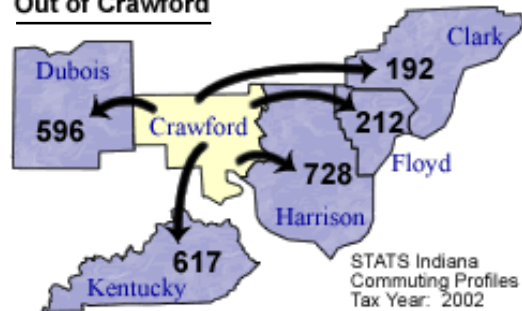

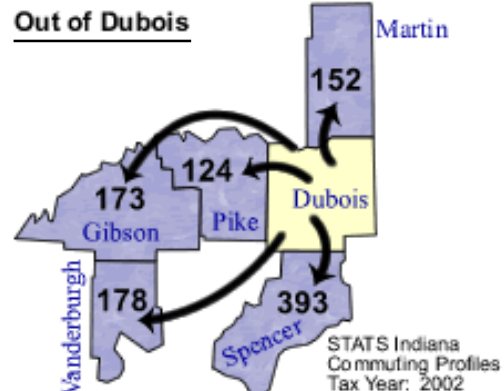

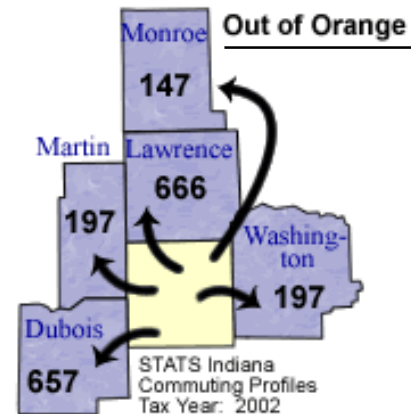

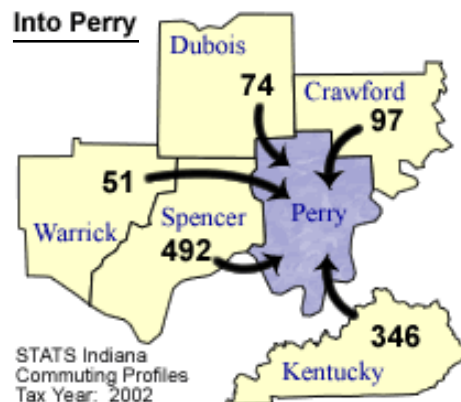

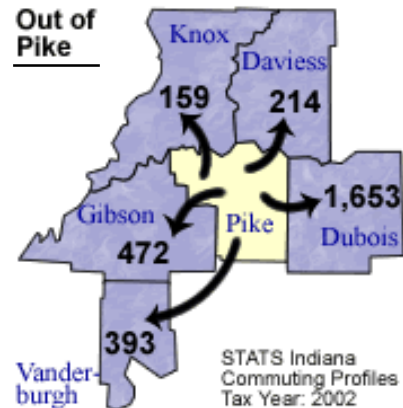

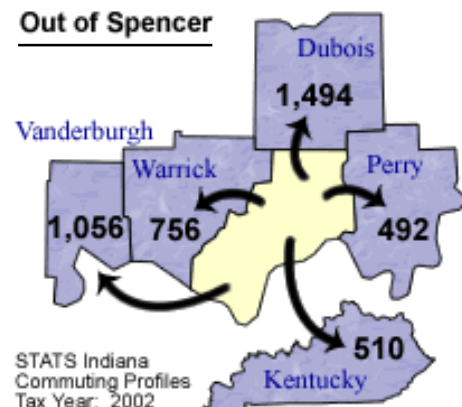
