SPEED LIMIT

15.04.010 Speed limit.

- (1) From and after the taking effect of this chapter it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to operate or run any automobile or motor bus along, upon or over the school zone, Wells Avenue, Main Street, Monon Street, Indiana Avenue, Broadway Street, and Beechwood Avenue in the Town of French Lick, Indiana, at a greater rate of speed than ten (10) miles per hour during the day time or night time. (Res. 87-1, Feb. 2, 1987) (Ord. 12-16-68, Dec. 16, 1968) (Minutes, Nov. 3, 1953) (Ord. No. 1, 1916, S1, Jan. 3, 1916)
- (2) Indiana Avenue in the newly annexed area is 30 miles per hour (Res. unnumbered, Sept. 19, 1960)
- (3) The speed limit for motor vehicle traffic on College Street from its intersection with Indiana Avenue to its intersection with Adams Street shall be 20 miles per hour (Ord. 12-16-68, S1, Dec. 16, 1968)
- (4) The speed limit of 20 miles per hour be imposed and regulated on Maple Street between State Highway 56 and Summit Circle (Res. 87-1, Feb. 2, 1987)
- (5) There be a 40 m.p.h. speed limit imposed on the 1.15 miles of State Highway 145 that lies within the French Lick Town Limits. This speed restriction extends from the "city limit" marker to the junction of State Highway 56 (vice versa) (Ord. 87-3, Apr. 20, 1987)
- (6) The Town of French Lick now declares that said street, Arnold F. Habig Boulevard, Located in the French Lick Industrial Park now have 25 m.p.h. speed limit. Be it also declared that this speed limit extend from the juncture of State Highway 145 and Gorge Road (R.R. #2). Signs will be posted of this speed limit to inform the public of the new regulation. 15.04.030 Penalty for violation. Any and all persons violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be fined and pay and forfeit to the said Town of French Lick the sum of TEN DOLLARS. (Ord. 12-16-68, SIV, Dec. 16, 1968) (Ord. No. 1, 1916, S3, Jan. 3, 1916)

15.15.010 Definitions. The term “taxicab” shall mean any motor vehicle designed and constructed to accommodate and transport passengers, not more than six [6] in number, not including the driver, and which does not operate over any definite and designated routes within the corporate limits of the town and the suburban territory thereof as said term “suburban territory” is defined in this chapter and the Indiana Motor Carrier Act of 1935 as found in IC 1971, 8-2-7-2 and acts amendatory thereto.

The term “suburban territory” means territory wholly within the State of Indiana which extends not more than one [1] mile beyond the corporate limits of any municipality in this state, as defined in the Indiana Motor Carrier Act of 1935, aforesaid. 15.15.020 License required. It shall be unlawful to engage in the business of operating a taxicab in the town without first having secured a license therefor. Applications for such licenses shall be made in writing to the town Clerk-Treasurer, on such forms as may be prescribed by said town Clerk-Treasurer, and shall state thereon the name of the applicant, the intended place of business and the number of cabs to be operated. If the applicant is a corporation, the names and addresses of the president and secretary thereof shall be given. (Ord. 97-5, S2, June 16, 1997) (Ord. 76-2, S1, May 3, 1976) (Ord. 15.15.030 Character of applicant. No such license shall be issued to or held by any person who is not a person of good character or who has been convicted of a felony; nor shall such

license be issued to or held by any corporation if any officer thereof would be ineligible for a license under the foregoing conditions. (Ord. 97-5, S3, June 16, 1997) (Ord. 76-2, S3, May 3, 1976)

15.15.040 Fee. The annual fee, payable in advance, for such license shall be Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each taxicab operated. Whenever the number of cabs so operated shall be increased during the license year, the licensee shall notify the town clerk-treasurer of such change and shall pay the additional fee. The town Clerk-Treasurer may issue suitable tags or stickers for the number of cabs covered by such license and such tag or sticker shall be displayed in a prominent place on each taxicab while it is in use, and may not be transferred to any taxicab put into service to replace one withdrawn from service. 15.15.050 Vehicles. No taxicab shall be operated unless it bears a town license duly issued; and no such cab shall be operated unless it is equipped with proper brakes, lights, tires, horn, muffler, rear vision mirror, and windshield wiper in good condition. It shall be the duty of the chief of police to inspect every taxicab so often as may be necessary to see to the enforcement of the provisions of this section. Each taxicab, while operated, shall have sufficient external lettering as to identify it as a taxicab to the general public. (Ord. 97-5, S5, June 16, 1997) (Ord. 76-2, S5, May 3, 1976)

15.15.060 Drivers. No person shall drive a taxicab, or be hired or permitted to do so, unless he is duly licensed as a chauffeur under the laws of the State of Indiana. It shall be unlawful for any driver of a taxicab while on duty to drink any intoxicating liquor, or to use any profane or obscene language, to shout or call to prospective passenger or to disturb the peace in any way. 15.15.070 Insurance. No taxicab shall be operated unless it is covered by a bond or public liability policy in an amount deemed adequate by the Board of Trustees of the Town of French Lick, Indiana. Proof of such insurance and liability shall be furnished to the Town Clerk-Treasurer at the time application is made for a license. (Ord. 97-5, S7, June 16, 1997) (Ord. 76-2, S7, May 3, 1976) (Ord. 15.15.080 Traffic rules. It shall be the duty of every driver of a taxicab to obey all traffic rules established by statute or ordinance. (Ord. 97-5, S8, June 16, 1997) (Ord. 76-2, S8, May 3, 1976) (Ord. No. 1, S2, Apr. 1, 1941) (Ord. 4, 1919, S7, June 16, 1919) (Ord. 4, 1918, S7, June 3, 1918)

15.15.090 Unlawful use. It shall be unlawful to knowingly permit any taxicab to be used in the perpetration of a crime. (Ord. 97-5, S9, June 16, 1997) (Ord. 76-2, S9, May 3, 1976)

15.15.100 Passengers. It shall be the duty of the driver of any taxicab to accept as a passenger any person who seeks to so use the taxicab, provided such person conducts himself in an orderly manner. No passenger shall be rejected service solely because of his race, creed, color, sex, or physical disability. No person shall be admitted to a taxicab already occupied by a passenger without the consent of the other passenger. The driver shall take his passenger to his destination by the most direct available route from the place where the passenger enters the cab. 15.15.110 Penalty. Any person or corporation violating the provisions of this chapter shall be subject to a fine of not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). In addition thereto, the Board of Trustees of the Town of French Lick, Indiana, may revoke the taxicab license of any licensee found violating any provision of this chapter. 15.15.200 Taxi stand on Lions Street.

- (1) Lions Street, across the Wells Lot from Highway 56 to Maple Street, is hereby designated as the official taxi stand for French Lick, Indiana (Ord. 4-60, S1, Oct. 1, 1960)
- (2) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation operating a motor vehicle for hire within the Town of French, Indiana to use a location other than the above designated official taxi stand for the solicitation of taxi business within the said town between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday and from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Saturday; holidays excepted. (Ord. 4-60, S2, Oct. 1, 1960)
- (3) It shall be unlawful for any operator of a vehicle, other than a passenger vehicle for hire, to park on said Lions Street during the periods of time set forth in Section (2) above. (Ord. 4-60, S3, Oct. 1, 1960)
- (4) It shall be unlawful for any vehicle driver to enter said Lions Street from Maple Street. (Ord. 4-60, S4, Oct. 1, 1960)
- (5) It shall be unlawful for any vehicle driver to park on the North said of said Lions Street. (Ord. 4-60, S5, Oct. 1, 1960)
- (6) Any person, firm, or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction shall be fined \$10.00 for the benefit of said Town of French Lick, Indiana, or a revocation of their license to haul passengers for hire, or both. (Ord. 4-60, S6, Oct. 1, 1960)

15.15.220 Revenue from licenses divided equally between French Lick and West Baden Springs. There is a large number of taxi license licenses issued and granted by the clerks of each of said towns for the carrying of passengers between said towns, and whereas said board of trustees deems it necessary and for the benefit of the traveling public and for the interest of said towns that a uniform arrangement should be had between said towns for the issuing of said licenses and the dividing of the fees received for the sale of taxi licenses.

Be it therefore resolved and ordained by the boards of trustees in joint session that from and after the adoption of this chapter that all taxi license that may be issued hereafter by either of clerks of said towns that the money received therefrom shall be divided equally between the said towns of French Lick and West Baden Springs.

Approved and adopted by each of the said boards of Trustees in joint session this 25th day of March, 1931. (Joint Ordinance unnumbered, S1, Mar. 25, 1931)

15.20.010 Parking restrictions. It is hereby declared to be unlawful for the stopping, standing or parking of motor vehicles on the curb line of any part of the following named streets in the area as therein designated:

- (1) No parking on the south side of College Street from Highway 56 (Beginning at McCampbells Hardward) going east to Jackson Street. No parking on the north side of College Street going west beginning at Adams Street (Beginning at John Henry's Restaurant) to Larry Bird Boulevard. (Res. 85-1, S1, Dec. 27, 1984) (Ord. No. 1, 1921, S2, Aug. 15, 1921)
- (2) Parking on "Downtown Maple Street" will have the following guidelines: Fifteen (15) minute parking will be allowed during the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. **NO PARKING** will be allowed on "Downtown Maple Street" (business section) from the hours of 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. (Ord. 99-6, S1, S2, S3, May 3, 1999) (Ord. No. 2, June 17, 1946) (Minutes, June 3, 1938) (Ord. Unnumbered, S1, March 16, 1931) Ord. No. 1, S1, May 21, 1928) (Ord. No. 1, 1921, S3, Aug. 15, 1921)
- (3) It shall be unlawful for any person to park any motor vehicle, buggy, carriage, wagon, tractor, engine or machine of any kind within fifteen feet of any fire hydrant in said Town; or to place any obstructions near such hydrants that prevents or hinders the free use of said hydrants by the Fire Dept. (Ord. No. 1, 1921, S4, Aug. 15, 1921)
- (4) No motor vehicle, buggy, carriage, wagon, tractor, engine or machine of any kind shall be parked or left standing by any person within thirty feet of any street crossing in said Town. (Ord. No. 1, 1921, S5, Aug. 15, 1921)
- (5) Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of French Lick, Indiana, in regular session, that from and after the passage of this chapter it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to park automobile, motor bus, truck or other vehicles on the short street connecting Maple Street and Indiana Avenue

and located on the north end of the Wells lot in the Town of French Lick. (Ord. unnumbered, S2, Mar. 16, 1931)

- (6) It shall be unlawful to park on the north of Main Street from Maple Street to Bowles Street (Minutes, June 3, 1938)
- (7) It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle, motor truck, motor bus, or any other type of motor driven conveyance upon either side of Bowles Street, in the Town of French Lick, Indiana. (Ord. No. 5, S1, Oct. 21, 1946)
- (8) The Board voted one hour parking on Wells Avenue, from Lincoln to Olive Street. (Minutes Apr. 7, 1947)
- (9) No parking on the West side of Walnut Street or fifty foot south on the east side of Walnut Street from its intersection with College Street to its intersection with Main Cross Street. (Ord. 2/5/68, Feb. 5, 1968) (Minutes, May 19, 1947)
- (10) The Board ordered 10 minute parking sign in front of the French Lick State Bank on Maple Street; and also to have curb painted and restrict parking in front of the Ritter Funeral Parlor in order that ambulance could be available at all times. (Minutes, Jan. 20, 1948)
- (11) Be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of the Town of French Lick, Orange County, Indiana, that from and after the publication of this chapter as provided by law, it shall be unlawful to park motor vehicles, motor trucks, motor busses, and any other type of motor driven conveyance on the south side of Poplar Street between Maple Street and Church Street in said Town. (Ord. #2, S1, July 21, 1953)
- (12) And be it further resolved by said Board of Trustees, aforesaid, that from and after the publication of this chapter, as provided by law, it shall be unlawful to park motor vehicles, motor buses, motor trucks, or any other type motor driven conveyance on the north side of Poplar Street between Maple Street and Church Street in said town for a period of longer than one hour, except Sunday when there shall be no limit to the time of parking such vehicles on the north side of said streets aforesaid. (Ord. #2, S2, July 21, 1953)
- (13) And be it further resolved by the Board of Trustees of such Town, aforesaid, that from and after the publication of this chapter as provided by law, it shall be unlawful to park motor vehicles, motor trucks, motor buses or any other type of motor driven conveyance for a period of longer than fifteen minutes on the west side of Walnut Street along Post Office lot. The parking meters in front of the Post Office were ordered removed and a 15 minute parking sign placed there. (Minutes, Feb. 15, 1960)

- (14) No parking on the north side of Michigan Street between Jackson and Short Streets. (Minutes, Nov. 3, 1953)
- (15) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park or cause to be parked on the west side of Washington Street from Ohio Street to Louise Street in the Town of French Lick. (Ord. 96-5, S1, Aug. 5, 1996) (Ord. 2/5/68, S1a, Feb. 5, 1968)
- (16) That on and after the taking of effect of this Chapter, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park or cause to be parked on the East side of Washington Street going South from Louise Street to Roosevelt Street in the Town of French Lick. (Ord. 96-5, S2, Aug. 5, 1996)
- (17) That on and after the taking of effect of this Chapter, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park or cause to be parked on the East side of Washington Street from Louise Street for 75 feet North (in the curve section). (Ord. 96-5, S3, Aug. 5, 1996)
- (18) The north side of Pluto Street from its intersection with Monon Street to its intersection with Bowles Street. (Ord. 2/5/68, S1b, Feb. 5, 1968)
- (19) The east side of Indiana Avenue from its intersection with Main Cross Street to Center Street. (Ord. 2/5/68, S1d, Feb. 5, 1968)
- (20) The south side of Olive Street from its intersection with Wells Avenue to its intersection with Hancock Street. (Ord. 2/5/68, S1e, Feb. 5, 1968)
- (21) The north side of Main Street from its intersection with Monon Street to a point presently served by parking meters. (Ord. 2/5/68, S1f, Feb. 5, 1968) (Ord. No. 1, 1921, S1, Aug. 15, 1921)
- (22) The north side of Ohio Street from its intersection with Short Street easterly to its intersection with Washington Street in said Town. (Ord. 9/2/69, S1, Sept. 2, 1969)
- (23) No parking on the east side of the entire length of Lincoln Street. (Ord. 76-11, S1, Dec. 20, 1976)
- (24) No parking on the north side of Louise Street between Short and Summit Streets.
- (25) On either side of Indiana Avenue from the intersection of Indiana Avenue and Plum Street to the intersection of Indiana Avenue and State Highway 56.

- (26) On Ohio Street from the intersection of Ohio Street and Adams Street to the intersection of Ohio Street and Jefferson Street. (Ord. 04-16, S1, S2, Dec. 27, 2004) (Ord. 98-5, S1, Aug 17, 1998)
- (27) On either side of Adams Street from the intersection of Adams Street and Delaware Street to the intersection of Adams Street and Ohio Street. (Ord. 06-02, S1, Jan. 23, 2006)
- (28) On either side of Olive Street from the intersection of Olive Street and Wells Avenue to the intersection of Olive Street and North Hancock Street. (Ord. 10-03, S1, Feb. 22, 2010)
- (29) On either side of North Hancock Street from the intersection of North Hancock Street and Olive Street to the intersection of North Hancock Street and North Street. (Ord. 10-03, S1, Feb. 22, 2010)
- (30) On the west side of West Hillside Drive from the intersection of South Plum Street to Indiana State Highway 56. (Ord. 18-03, S1, July 2, 2018)
- (31) On the east side of South Adams Street from the intersection of West College Street to South Washington Street. (Ord. 18-03, S1, July 2, 2018)
- (32) On the north west side of Larry Bird Blvd from the intersection of College Street to Indiana State Highway 145. (Ord. 19-02, S1, Feb. 18, 2019)
- (33) On either side of South Jefferson Street from the intersection of West Weaver Street to the intersection of South Washington Street. (Ord. 19-04, S1, May, 20, 2019)
- (34) On either side of West Ohio Street from the intersection of West Poplar Street to the intersection of South Short Street. (Ord. 19-04, S1, May, 20, 2019)
- (35) On either side of West Commerce Street from the intersection of South Indiana Avenue to the intersection of North Maple Street. (Ord. 19-04, S1, May, 20, 2019)
- (36) On either side of South Center Street from its northern intersection with South Indiana Street to its southern intersection of with South Indiana Street. (Ord. 19-04, S1, May, 20, 2019)
- (37) On the either side of West Virginia Street from the intersection of South Lincoln Avenue to the intersection of Indiana Avenue. (Ord. 19-04, S1, May, 20, 2019)
- (38) On East side of Orange Street from the intersection of College Street to the intersection of Main Street. (Ord. 20-02, S1, Jan. 6, 2020)

15.20.015 Vehicles parked for seven days or longer prohibited. It is further declared to be unlawful for any motor vehicle to be parked on any other street for a period of seven (7) days, or longer. (Ord. 2/5/68, S2, Feb. 5, 1968)

15.20.016 Towing of violators. Be it further ordained that any vehicle discovered violating the foregoing provisions shall be subject to being towed to the town garage at the owners expense. (Ord. 2/5/68, S3, Feb. 5, 1968)

15.20.017 Parking of trailers prohibited. It shall be unlawful to park any trailer on a street within the Town of French Lick. The term trailer shall include, but not limited to, boat trailers, semi trailers, and utility trailers. The term shall not include any trailer that is attached to a vehicle. (Ord. 05-06, S1, Oct. 3, 2005)

15.20.020 Erection of signs. The Street Commissioner of the Town of French Lick, Orange County, is hereby directed to erect proper signs, properly located which shall indicate the parking limitations prescribed. (Ord. #254, July 21, 1953)

15.20.040 Penalty for violation. Any person who violates this chapter shall be fined Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00). (Ord. 04-16, S2, Dec. 27, 2004) (Ord. 76-11, S2, Dec. 20, 1976) (Ord. 2/5/68, S4, Feb. 5, 1968) (Ord. # 2, S5, July 21, 1953) (Ord. No. 5, S4, Oct. 21, 1946) (Ord. 15.21.010 Physician's statement. A handicap person will supply to the Town Council a physician's statement indicating (describing) their handicap which deems it appropriate to have a reserved parking facility (space) in front of their residence. (Ord. 99-7, June 7, 1999)

15.21.020 Erection of handicap sign. The Town of French Lick will erect a "handicap" sign in front of the "handicapped" person's residence. (Ord. 99-7, June 7, 1999)

15.21.030 Painting of curb. The Town of French Lick will paint the curb "blue" (one car length) in front of the "handicapped" person's residence along with the erected "handicap" sign. (Ord. 99-7, June 7, 1999)

15.21.040 Penalty for violation. Any person who knowingly parks a vehicle in the "handicapped" section (curb painted blue and "handicapped" sign being posted in same area) and NOT being of the handicapped nature will be subsequently fined for this violation. (The fine/penalty will be the rate that has been previously established at the time of violation). (Ord. 99-7, June 7, 1999)

15.22.010 Definitions.

- (1) The word “vehicle” shall mean any device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported upon a highway, except a device which is operated upon rails or tracks.
- (2) The word “street” shall mean any public street, avenue, road, boulevard, highway or other public place located in the Town of French Lick, Indiana.
- (3) The word “person” shall mean and include any individual, firm, partnership, or corporation.
- (4) The word “operator” shall mean and include every individual who shall operate a vehicle as the owner thereof or as the agent, employee or permittee of the owner.
- (5) The word “truck” shall be construed to mean any vehicle of capacity more than 1/2 ton or larger than a “pick-up” truck.
- (6) “Parking meter” shall mean a mechanical device located upon a public street or sidewalk in a place designated by ordinance as a parking meter zone hereafter defined, which device shall record a certain number of minutes by the use of a clock mechanism determining the period of time for which parking privileges may be extended to the person depositing a coin therein.
- (7) “Parking meter zone” shall mean an area designated by ordinance where a vehicle may be temporarily parked and allowed to remain for the period of

time indicated on the meter. (Ord. 77-4, S1, May 16, 1977) (Ord. No. 1, S1, May 5, 1953)

15.22.020 Parking meter zone. The following areas in the Town of French Lick, Indiana, are hereby established as parking meter zones:

On Highway # 56 from the Sheraton Flower Shop to Main Street on the east side of the street; on Main Street from Maple Street to Weavers Motors garage building on both north and south sides of street; on Maple Street from Highway # 56 to College Street, on east side of the street; on College Street from Bowles Street to Maple Street on north side of street; on College Street from Maple Street to Highway # 56 on north and south sides of street; on Highway # 56 from Our Lady of The Spring Catholic Church to Olive Street on north side of street; and on Indiana Avenue from Highway # 56 to Poplar Street on east side of the street. Also, on Maple Street from College Street to Poplar Street on the east and west sides of the street. (Ord. 77-4, S2, May 16, 1977) (Ord. No. 1, S2, May 5, 1953)

15.22.030 Parking rules. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle or to permit a vehicle to remain parked, in any parking meter zone for a period longer than designated on such meter, between the hours designated thereon, except on Sundays and holidays (the term "holiday" shall include the following days only: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, General Election Day, and Christmas Day) or to park a vehicle in any zone without paying the fee hereinafter designated; or to permit a vehicle to remain parked longer in any such zone than for the period for which fee was paid; except on Sundays, Wednesdays, and Holidays. (Ord. 77-6, S1, July 18, 1977) (Ord. 77-4, S3, May 16, 1977) (Ord. No. 1, S2, May 5, 1953)

15.22.031 Trucks and busses. It shall be unlawful for trucks and busses to park in meter zones at all times. (Ord. No. 1, S10, May 5, 1953)

15.22.032 Commercial delivery trucks. Commercial trucks may park in parking zones to load or to unload merchandise, without depositing coins for a period not to exceed thirty (30) minutes. Should any truck or delivery car be parked longer than thirty (30) minutes said violator will be given a ticket and such act classed as a violation, and the regular penalty imposed. (Ord. No. 1, S5a, May 5, 1953)

15.22.040 Placing meters. Parking meters shall be installed in the parking meter zones as established and provided for by ordinance and shall be placed upon the curb immediately adjacent to the individual parking places hereinafter described. Each parking meter shall be placed or set in such a manner as to show or display a signal whether or not the parking space adjacent to such meter is legally in use. (Ord. 77-4, S4, May 16, 1977) (Ord. No. 1, S3, May 5, 1953)

15.22.050 Marking places. The Chief of Police shall have markings painted or placed upon the curb of street adjacent to each parking meter for the purpose of designating the parking place and the angle at which vehicles are parked to the curb. Each vehicle parking within any parking meter zone shall park within the line or markings so established. It shall be unlawful

to park any vehicle across any such line or marking or to park said vehicle in such position that the same shall not be entirely within the area designated by such lines or markings. (Ord. 77-4, S5, May 16, 1977) (Ord. No. 1, S4, May 5, 1953)

15.22.060 Placing coins in meters. Any person desiring to park any vehicle within such parking meter space shall deposit the proper coins for the time desired as follows:

One cent for each twelve minutes of time desired;

Five cents or one nickel for each hour of time desired;

Ten cents or one dime for two hours of time desired; and

Twenty-five cents or one quarter for each eight hours of time desired.

15.22.070 Tampering with meters. It shall be unlawful for any person not authorized by the Board of Trustees to deface, injure, tamper with, open or willfully break, destroy, or impair the usefulness of any parking meter installed under the provisions of this chapter. 15.22.075 Annual parking sticker. Such notice shall be made in duplicate and shall be serially numbered and show the specific violation charged, the state license number of such vehicle, and the owner's or operator's name [if possible to obtain the same], and shall be signed by such officer or person. One copy of such notice shall be presented to the owner or operator of such vehicle, and, in case such owner or his representatives shall not be found in possession of or in charge of such vehicle, the posting of such notice or the attachment thereof in a conspicuous place on such vehicle shall be deemed a sufficient notice of such violation. It shall be the duty of such officer or other person serving such notice to file the duplicate copy thereof in the town office at the close of the day's work. Any person accused of a violation of this chapter may settle and compromise the claim against him or her for such violation by paying to the Town of French Lick, Indiana, the sum of \$3.00 for each violation. Payment may be made at the police station, Town Hall, or in collection boxes for that purpose. A receipt shall be issued for all money so received, if requested, and such money shall be promptly turned over to the Clerk-Treasurer to be credited to the parking meter fund. Whenever any person has been issued three (3) or more notices as provided in this chapter, and shall fail or refuse to pay the penalties for violation prescribed

herein, it shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to initiate proceedings for the collection of the same on the small claims docket of the Orange Circuit Court as now or hereafter provided by the laws of the State of Indiana. When five (5) notices have been served pursuant to the provisions of this chapter and said notice have not been paid, then the Chief of Police shall prepare a list of motor vehicles showing thereon the type of vehicle and the state license number thereof and the owner's name where known and shall furnish said list to the person charged with the enforcement of this chapter and where such vehicle is found then such law enforcement officer shall notify the Clerk-Treasurer and said vehicle shall be removed to a place of safe keeping and the unpaid violations shall be filed in the Orange Circuit Court as above provided and said vehicle shall not be released except on the written direction of the Judge of said Court. Where five (5) or more of said notices remain unpaid as provided in this section, then such vehicle is hereby declared to be a nuisance. (Ord. 77-6, S3, July 18, 1977) (Ord. 77-4, S9, May 16, 1977)

15.22.130 Use of parking meter deposits. Vehicular traffic shall move only in the indicated direction when signs indicating the lawful direction of traffic movement are erected and maintained at intersections and alleys where movement of traffic in the opposite direction is prohibited. 15.59.010 Definitions.

- (1) For the purpose of this section, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the following meanings given herein:
 - A. Town shall mean the Town of French Lick, Indiana.
 - B. Person shall mean any person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company or organization of any kind.
 - C. Truck shall mean any vehicle designed or operated for the transportation of property, and whose payload rating is over one (1) ton. (Ord. 14-07, S1, Aug. 4, 2014)

15.59.020 Load Limits.

- (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any truck on any public street or right-of-way in the town, other than on state highways, which has a gross weight in excess of 50,000 pounds, a trailer length exceeding 36 ft, unless permitted by the city to do so. In the event a permit is required, an indemnity bond may be required to be posted with the city to cover possible damage to its streets, bridges, culverts or drainage easements, which may be damaged by the moving of said excessive weight loads over and along these streets.
- (2) The indemnity bond of no less than \$50,000.00 shall remain in force and effect or ninety (90) days from the initial execution date of the permit. The amount of the bond shall be determined by guidelines established by the Town Council with reasonable consideration of the type of vehicle, the amount of excess weight, the distance to be traveled on the streets and the condition of the streets to be traveled. (Ord. 14-07, S2, Aug. 4, 2014)

15.59.030 Oversize/Overweight Permit.

- (1) A permit may be issued under the direction of the Town Council or his/her designee for the travel of trucks over town streets within the town with loads in excess of the load limits provided in Section 15.59.020, but only when it is impossible or impractical to reduce the weight of the load or use a truck capable of hauling the load within the prescribed limit.
- (2) Such permit shall be issued for a maximum period of ninety (90) days. The Town Council shall determine route of travel of said truck and the amount of the bond, if any, but the amount shall not be less than \$50,000.00. The permit shall specify the date of the trip, the license plate number of the truck and the route of travel. A permit fee of \$10.00 for the issuance of the permit shall be paid to the city by the applicant prior to issuance. (Ord. 14-07, S3, Aug. 4, 2014)

15.59.040 Truck Routes. All trucks shall confine their travel within the town to the designated “truck route”. (Ord. 14-07, S4, Aug. 4, 2014)

15.59.050 Loading and Unloading. In the event that a truck must completely or partially load and/or unload at a point which does not lie on a designated truck route, the truck may proceed to and from such points of loading and/or unloading, providing that the truck follows the shortest route from a designated truck route to and from each point of loading or unloading or otherwise as may be specified by the Town Council. (Ord. 14-07, S5, Aug. 4, 2014)

15.59.060 Exceptions.

- (1) This section shall not prohibit:
 - A. The operation of emergency vehicles upon any street in the city.
 - B. The operation of trucks owned or operated by the town, or contracted by the town, upon any street in the town.
 - C. The operator of any tractor by a resident in transit between his or her home and place of employment.
 - D. Deliveries to local retail establishments, as long as the truck does not physically or visually block roadway or street. Truck must park in a designated parking spot or parking lot. (Ord. 14-07, S6, Aug. 4, 2014)

15.59.070 Enforcement of Section; Weighing. The city shall keep and maintain accurate maps setting out truck routes and streets upon which truck traffic is permitted. The maps shall be kept on file at the city hall and police department and shall be made available to the public. The Chief of Police shall have the authority to require any person driving or in control of a

truck to proceed to any public or private scale available for the purpose of weighing and determining whether this chapter has been complied with. Upon such weighing, if it is determined that the truck so weighed is in excess of the load limit, then the cost of such weighing shall be immediately due and payable by the operator of such truck and such truck may be lawfully detained by the police department until such charge has been paid. In the event that the weight of such truck is not in excess of the load limit, any charges for weighing shall be paid by the town. Any charge for weighing under the terms of this section shall be in addition to any fine imposed for a violation of its provisions. (Ord. 14-07, S7, Aug. 4, 2014)

- (1) North Maple Street, between College Street and Main Street - The new Weight Restrictions are: NO MOTOR VEHICLE WEIGHING MORE THAN 7,000 POUNDS CAN TRAVEL ON SAID STREET. Be it also stated that a sign will be posted stating said limitation before enforcement shall become effective.
- (2) No motor vehicle weighing more than twelve (12) tons shall be allowed to travel on College Street between the intersection of College Street and Larry Bird Boulevard and the intersection of College Street and State Highway 56. Vehicles making delivery to locations between said intersections shall be exempt from this provision.
- (3) No motor vehicle weighing more than twelve (12) tons shall be allowed to travel on Main Street between the intersection of Main Street and Larry Bird Boulevard and the intersection of Main Street and State Highway 56. Vehicles making delivery to locations between said intersections shall be exempt from this provision. (Ord. 04-01, S1, 2, 3, Oct. 4, 2004)

15.60.020 Penalty for violation of Section 15.60.010. Be it also declared that said penalty (fine) of NO MORE THAN \$2,500.00, NOR LESS THAN \$1.00, will be levied against any and all violators of Section 15.60.010. (Ord. 87-6, Aug. 31, 1987)

15.60.200 Weight restrictions for parking on certain streets. Effective immediately NO known vehicle to weigh 7,000 or more will be allowed to park on the Town's public streets." (Ord. 98-6, Oct. 19, 1998) (Ord. 98-4, S1, May 18, 1998)

15.60.210 Penalty for violation of Section 15.60.200. A fine of \$25.00 will be imposed for any violators of this Chapter. That the only exception to the above stated fact being when the vehicle having the “intent” to “drop” their “load” at a specific business located on one or any of the above stated streets. (Ord. 87-7, S2, Aug. 3, 1987)

15.62.020 Posting of signs. Be it, also, declared that signs be posted to indicate such restrictions.

15.62.030 Penalty for violation. Penalties (fines) of no more than \$2,500.00, nor less than \$1.00 will be levied against all violators. (Ord. 87-7, Aug. 3, 1987)

15.64.010 Restricted Street Defined. As used in this Chapter, the term, “Length Restricted Street” shall mean the following local streets or parts of streets:

- (1) Jack Carnes Way, including the traffic circle adjacent State Highway 56
- (2) Cook Street
- (3) Main Street
- (4) College Street, between its intersection with Larry Bird Boulevard and State Highway 56.
- (5) Maple Street between Main and College
- (6) Bowles Street. (Ord. 08-08, S1, Oct. 20, 2008)

15.64.020 Local Delivery Defined. As used in this chapter, the term “Local Delivery” shall mean a delivery to a building, specific location on a building or other destination that can only be accessed by use of a Length Restricted Street. (Ord. 08-08, S2, Oct. 20, 2008)

15.64.030 Truck Traffic Restricted. Vehicles with a total length in excess of thirty two (32) feet, including the length of trailers, shall be allowed to travel on Length Restricted Streets for the purpose of making a Local Delivery only and for no other purpose. (Ord. 08-08, S3, Oct. 20, 2008)

15.64.040 Penalty. Violation of this chapter shall be punishable by a fine of up to Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per occurrence. (Ord. 08-08, S4, Oct. 20, 2008)

USE OF GOLF CARTS ON PUBLIC STREETS

15.66.010 Definitions.

- (1) “Roadways” means that portion of a town highway, road, street, alley or right of way improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular travel or parking.
- (2) “Golf Cart” means a gas or electric powered vehicle having three or four wheels designed and intended to transport golf equipment and people while playing golf and not designed primarily for travel on the public highways. (Ord. 10-08, S1, May 17, 2010)

15.66.020 Operation Authorized. The operation of Golf Carts is hereby authorized on all roadways within the Town of French Lick. Any person operating a Golf Cart under permit has all the rights and duties applicable to the driver of any other vehicle, except when those provisions cannot reasonably be applied to Golf Carts. This provision does not authorize use of Golf Carts on any state highway, except as required to cross a state highway at a right angle. (Ord. 10-08, S2, May 17, 2010)

15.66.030 Required Equipment. The following equipment is required on any Golf Cart during operation upon any roadway:

- (1) The slow moving vehicle emblem provided for by state statute, properly mounted on the rear of the golf cart pursuant to state regulations;
- (2) A rear view mirror, properly mounted on the golf cart so as to reflect to the operator a view of the street for a distance of at least two hundred (200) feet to the rear of the golf cart;
- (3) One four-foot red safety flag properly mounted on the rear of the golf cart. (Ord. 10-08, S3, May 17, 2010)

15.66.040 Unlawful Acts. It is unlawful for any person to operate a Golf Cart on any roadway within the Town where:

- (1) the operator does not have in his possession a valid, current and un-revoked drivers license;
- (2) the Golf Cart is operated at night between sunset and sunrise;
- (3) the Golf Cart is being operated during inclement weather or when visibility is impaired by weather, smoke, fog, or other condition, or at any time when there is insufficient light to clearly see persons or vehicles on the roadway at a distance of five hundred (500) feet;
- (4) the Golf Cart is not equipped with the required equipment described under Section 15.66.030;
- (5) the operator does not have current liability insurance coverage; and
- (6) the operator fails to observe all traffic laws and regulations, except when those provisions cannot reasonably be applied to Golf Carts. (Ord. 10-08, S4, May 17, 2010)

15.66.050 Violations. Violations of this Chapter shall be punished as a Class C infraction. (Ord. 10-08, S5, May 17, 2010)
