6.05.001 Authorization. I.C. §36-9-2-7 authorizes a Town to regulate the use of its public ways, and I.C. §9-21-4-11 authorizes a Town to designate intersections as stop or yield intersections with reference to streets and highways under their jurisdiction and to erect stop or yield signs as such designated intersections. (Ord. 2-96, Whereas, Apr. 3, 1996)

6.05.002 Purpose. The Holland Town Council has determined that it is in the best interest of said Town and to protect the safety of its citizens to designate certain street and public way intersections within the jurisdiction of the Town as stop intersections. (Ord. 2-96, Whereas, Apr. 3, 1996)

6.05.010 Designation of 4-Way Stop Intersections. The following street and public way intersections within the Town of Holland, Indiana, shall be designated as "4-Way Stop Intersections":

4th and Iowa Streets

3rd and Linn Streets

6.05.020 Designation of 3-Way Stop Intersections. The following street and public way intersections within the Town of Holland, Indiana, shall be designated as "3-Way Stop Intersections". Vehicular traffic traveling upon the following streets in the following directions shall stop before entering the following intersections:

Traffic traveling north or south on 5th Street at its intersection with Linn Street, and traffic traveling East on Linn Street at its intersection with 5th Street.

Traffic traveling north or south on 6th Street at its intersection with Indiana Street, and traffic traveling West on Indiana Street at its intersection with 6th Street.

6.05.030 Designation of 2-Way Stop Intersections. All vehicular traffic traveling upon the following streets or public ways (hereinafter called "Stop Streets") within the Town of Holland, Indiana, shall stop before entering the intersection with the following arterial streets (hereinafter called "Through Streets"):

6.05.050 Erection of Signs. The Holland Town Council hereby directs that stop signs be erected at appropriate locations at the above intersections so as to identify the above stop intersections within the Town of Holland, Indiana. (Ord. 2-96, S 6.05.50, Apr. 3, 1996)

RULES GOVERNING MOVEMENT OF TRAFFIC

6.08.010 Reckless driving prohibited. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Holland, Dubois County, Indiana, that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, to drive an automobile, motor bus, motor truck or other motor vehicle, over and along the streets, alleys and public places within the corporate limits of said town, in a reckless or careless manner either by an unreasonable speed; or drives such vehicle grossly, rudely and in a boisterously manner, and not on the proper side of such street or alley; or endangers the safety of any passing or parked vehicle and other property; or the safety of any standing or walking pedestrian be it man, woman, or child; or in any other manner makes a nuisance or menace of him or themselves. (Ord. 8, S1, April 22, 1929)

6.08.020 Penalties for violations. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this chapter, and upon conviction thereof, before any Justice of the Peace or other court having jurisdiction, shall be fined not more than \$5.00 for the first offense, and shall be fined not more than \$10.00 for the second offense, and shall be fined not more than \$25.00 for a third offense, together with a revocation of any right or license as a driver of any such vehicle, together with the cost of the prosecution in each instance. (Ord, 8, S2, April 22, 1929)

6.08.030 Speed Limit. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, to drive a motor vehicle over and along the streets, alleys and public places within the corporate limits of the Town of Holland exceeding the posted speed of 25 miles per hour unless posted otherwise.

Violation of this provision shall be enforceable by filing of an infraction or a criminal offense according to the applicable State law. (Ord. 02-13, S6.08.030, July 10, 2013)

6.10.010 Parking restrictions.

- (1) There shall be no parking at any time on the sidewalks in the Town of Holland, Indiana.
- (2) There shall be no parking on any street in the Town of Holland when such parking blocks a private drive, preventing ingress and egress by the owner of said drive.
- (3) There shall be no parking in alleys or fire lanes in the Town of Holland, except to load or unload vehicles, and then not to exceed thirty (30) minutes.
- (4) All vehicles parked on any street in the Town of Holland, where two-way traffic is permitted, will be parked with the right-hand wheels of the vehicle parallel to and not more than twelve (12) inches from the right-hand curb, or if no curb exists, parallel to the right-hand side of the street, off of the traveled portion thereof.
- (5) No person driving or in charge of a motor vehicle shall permit it to stand unattended without first stopping the engine, and locking the ignition.
- (6) There shall be no parking in the Town of Holland on any street or in any designated area not conforming to either temporary or permanent restrictions placed on said street or area properly posted as such.
- (7) There shall be no double-parking on the streets in the Town of Holland, except temporary parking not to exceed thirty (30) minutes to permit vehicles obtaining or containing merchandise or materials to load or unload in the process of serving business establishments when curblane parking is not available.
- (8) No person shall enter into any public park owned or operated by the Town of Holland, when said park has been duly closed to the public and posted accordingly. (Ord. 30-77, SI 1-8, 1977)

6.10.011 Loading and Unloading Zone. The Town of Holland shall designate a loading and unloading zone at 101 N. 4th Street beginning at the entrance door to 103 N. 4th Street and continuing 30 feet to the south. (Ord. 06-05, S6.10.011, Aug. 9, 2006)

6.10.040 Towing illegally parked vehicles. The Town Marshall is hereby authorized to remove and tow away, or have removed and tow away by commercial towing service, any car or other motor vehicle illegally parked in any place where such parked vehicle creates or constitutes a hazard or obstruction to the movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on the public streets, alleys, or other public areas in the Town of Holland, which at the time are in violation of any of the provisions of this Chapter. Vehicles so towed away for illegal parking shall be stored in a safe place and shall be returned to the owner or operator of such vehicle upon payment of the charges made by the commercial towing service for the towing of said vehicle and any storage charges which may be incurred. (Ord. 36-79. S4, 1979)

6.10.080 Penalties. Any person, firm, association or corporation found to be violating any of the provisions of this Chapter, shall upon conviction or plea of guilty be fined in a sum not to exceed \$50.00 for each offense or violation of this Chapter. (Ord. unnumbered, S6.10.080, 2020) (Ord. 30-77, SVI 1, 1977)

6.10.090 Payment of fines. Any person, firm, association or corporation charged with a violation under this Chapter may mail or deliver to the Town Clerk-Treasurer, Holland, Indiana, the sum of \$25.00 for offense charged, together with a copy of the Ticket, which shall indicate that the person charged wishes to enter a plea of guilty to the violation charge, and accepts the sum of \$25.00 for the fine for such violation. The Clerk-Treasurer shall upon receipt of such sum or sums from the person charged, issue a written receipt to such person acknowledging the payment of the agreed fine. (Ord. unnumbered, S6.10.090, 2020) (Ord. 30-77, SVI 2, 1977)

6.10.100 Failure to comply with penalties and fines. Failure of any person charged to comply with the provisions of the above Section 6.10.090 within fifteen (15) days of the date of the charging of the offense will result in a formal affidavit charging the violation of this Chapter being filed in the Court having appropriate jurisdiction. (Ord. 30-77, SVI 3, 1977)

6.20.010 Definitions. "Abandoned vehicle " when used in conjunction with this Chapter shall mean:

- (1) Any vehicle located on public premises which does not have lawfully affixed thereto or displayed thereon, a valid unexpired registration plate permitting its operation upon the highways of the State of Indiana.
- (2) Any vehicle which is parked or is located upon public premises continuously without being moved for a period of seven (7) days except next to the legal or temporary residence of the owner.
- (3) Any vehicle parked or located on public premises illegally or in such manner as to constitute a hazard or obstruction to the movement of pedestrian or other vehicle traffic on a public right-of-way, street or highway.
- (4) Any vehicle that has remained on private premises without the consent of the owner or person in control of such premises for more that forty-eight (48) hours.
- (5) Any vehicle from which there has been removed the engine or transmission or differential or which is otherwise partially dismantled or inoperable and left unattended on public premises for more than seven (7) days. (Ord. 30-77, SVI 1, 1977)

6.20.020 Abandonment prohibited. No person shall permit a vehicle owned by him to be abandoned upon any public premises as defined in the above subsection within the limits of the Town of Holland, Indiana. (Ord. 30-77, SIV 2, 1977)

6.20.030 Penalties. Any person, firm, association or corporation found to be violating any of the provisions of this Chapter, shall upon conviction or plea of guilty, be fined in a sum not to exceed Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) for each offense or violation of this Chapter. (Ord. 30-77, SVI 1, 1977)

6.20.040 Payment of fine. Any person, firm, association or corporation charged with a violation under this Chapter may mail or deliver to the Town Clerk-Treasurer, Holland, Indiana, the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each offense charged, together with a copy of the ticket, which shall indicate that the person charged wishes to enter a guilty plea to the violation charged, and accepts the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for the fine for such violation. The Clerk-Treasurer, shall upon the receipt of such sum or sums from the person charged, issue a written receipt to such person acknowledging the payment of the agreed fine. (Ord. 30-77, SVI 2, 1977)

6.20.050 Failure to comply with penalties and fines. Failure of any person charged to comply with the provisions of the above Section 6.20.040 within fifteen (15) days of the date of the charging of the offense will result in a formal affidavit charging the violation of this Chapter being filed in the Court having appropriate jurisdiction. (Ord. 30-77, SVI 3, 1977)

BICYCLES

6.24.010 Lamps and illumination. It is hereby declared to be unlawful to operate a bicycle upon the public streets, sidewalks, or other public ways within the Town of Holland at night without illumination by means of a light permanently affixed to said bicycle.

6.24.080 Penalties. Any person, firm, association or corporation found to be violating any of the provisions of this Chapter, shall upon conviction or plea of guilty, be fined in a sum not to exceed Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) for each offense or violation of this Chapter. (Ord. 30-77, SVI 3, 1977)

6.24.090 Payment of fine. Any person, firm, association or corporation charged with a violation under this Chapter may mail or deliver to the Town Clerk-Treasurer, Holland, Indiana, the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each offense charged, together with a copy of the ticket, which shall indicate that the person charged wishes to enter a guilty plea to the violation charged, and accepts the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for the fine for such violation. The Clerk-Treasurer, shall upon the receipt of such sum or sums from the person charged, issue a written receipt to such person acknowledging the payment of the agreed fine. (Ord. 30-77, SVI 2, 1977)

6.24.100 Failure to comply with penalties and fines. Failure of any person charged to comply with the provisions of the above Section 6.24.090 within fifteen (15) days of the date of the charging of the offense will result in a formal affidavit charging the violation of this Chapter being filed in the court having appropriate jurisdiction. (Ord. 30-77, SVI 3, 1977)

GOLF CARTS ON PUBLIC STREETS

6.30.010 Purpose. For purposes of this chapter, “golf cart” means a 4 wheeled self-propelled vehicle commonly designed and manufactured for operation on a golf course; however, also capable of transporting no more than 4 passengers, and not capable of traveling at speeds exceeding 25 mph, operated within the limits of the Town of Holland. (Ord. 2007-5, SA, Aug. 8, 2007)

6.30.020 Required Equipment.

- (1) All golf carts shall be equipped with two (2) headlights, one on each side of the front of the golf cart. (Ord. 2007-5, SB, Aug. 8, 2007)
- (2) All golf carts must be equipped with at least one red brake light on the back of the golf cart to be visible from at least three hundred (300) feet at night. (Ord. 2007-5, SC, Aug. 8, 2007)
- (3) All golf carts must be equipped with brakes adequate to control the movement of and to stop and hold the golf cart, and all golf carts must be equipped with rear-view mirror. (Ord. 2007-5, SD, Aug. 8, 2007)

6.30.030 Operator Requirements.

- (1) All Operators of golf carts must be a licensed driver and possess a valid operators/drivers license issued by the State of Indiana. (Ord. 2007-5, SE, Aug. 8, 2007)
- (2) All operators of golf carts must operate the golf cart in a safe manner and must obey all posted traffic signs and traffic laws during the operation of the golf cart. (Ord. 2007-5, SF, Aug. 8, 2007)
- (3) The operators of the golf cart shall obey the speed limit and there shall be no more than one (1) operator and one (1) passenger if the golf cart is a one seat golf cart; and one (1) operator and three (3) passengers if the golf cart is a two seat golf cart; during operation. (Ord. 2007-5, SG, Aug. 8, 2007)

6.30.040 Violations/Fines. Any operator who violates any equipment or guidelines provision of this chapter shall be subject to a \$15.00 fine for the initial violation and a \$25.00 fine for each subsequent violation, as well as possible traffic tickets for failing to obey traffic laws. (Ord. 2007-5, SH, Aug. 8, 2007)

6.30.050 Registration. Each golf cart operator within the limits of the Town of Holland must be registered with the Clerk-Treasurer each year before February 15; to obtain registration, the owner of said golf cart must present proof of liability insurance in an amount at least that required by the State of Indiana for the operation of a motor vehicle; and the owner shall pay an annual registration fee of \$15.00. Fees collected as a result of this subsection shall be placed in the general fund. (Ord. 2007-5, SI, Aug. 8, 2007)

6.30.060 Policies and Procedures. The Clerk-Treasurer and Town Marshall are hereby directed to develop and publish such policies and procedures necessary to carry out the intent of this chapter. (Ord. 2007-5, SJ, Aug. 8, 2007)

6.32.010 Operation Permitted. Off-road vehicles, if appropriately registered as required under I.C. 14-16-1 and if operated by an individual who has a valid motor vehicles driver's license as required under I.C. 14-16-1-20(c), may be operated on roadways, which are not highways in the Indiana State Highway System, within the municipal boundaries of the Town of Holland. (Ord. 2018-03, S1, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S1, 2017)

6.32.020 Definition. "Off-road vehicle", shall be defined as a motor driven vehicle of at least four wheels capable of cross-country travel, without benefit of a road; and, on or immediately over land, water, snow, ice, marsh, swampland, or other natural terrain. The term "off road vehicle" shall not include any farm vehicle being used for farming, a snowmobile, any other vehicle properly registered by the bureau of motor vehicles, any watercraft that is registered under Indiana statutes, or a golf cart vehicle. (Ord. 2018-03, S2, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S2, 2017)

6.32.030 Registration. A registered vehicle shall be one issued and displaying two current registration decals issued for that vehicle by the Indiana Department of Natural Resources, unless otherwise exempted under I.C. 14-16-1-8. (Ord. 2018-03, S3, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S3, 2017)

6.32.040 Requirements for Operation. No off-road vehicle shall be operated on roads within the Town of Holland unless it is approved by the Town of Holland. Any off-road vehicle operated on a road within the corporate boundaries of the Town of Holland:

- (1) may not be operated between sunset and sunrise unless the vehicle has at least two (2) functioning headlights and two (2) functioning taillights;

- (2) may not be operated at any time unless the vehicle has adequate brakes capable of producing deceleration at fourteen (14) feet a second on level ground at a speed of twenty (20) miles per hour; and
- (3) must be equipped with a muffler in good working order and in constant operation so as to prevent excessive or unusual noise or annoying smoke and must not be operated when having a number of passengers in excess of that for which said vehicle is certified by the manufacturer. (Ord. 2018-03, S4, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S4, 2017)

6.32.050 Speed Limits. No off-road vehicle may be operated at a rate of speed greater than posted speed limit or, as provided by I.C. 14-16-1-23, at such lesser rate of speed as is reasonable and proper having due regard for existing conditions and will not unnecessarily endanger the person or property of another. No operator of an off-road vehicle shall be under the influence of alcoholic beverages or unlawfully under the influence of a narcotic or other habit forming or dangerous depressant or stimulant drug, and shall comply with all other restrictions set forth in I.C. 14-16-1-23. (Ord. 2018-03, S5, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S5, 2017)

6.32.060 Accident Procedure. The operator of any off-road vehicle involved in an accident resulting in serious bodily injury or in death or in property damage in an estimated amount of at least \$750.00 shall immediately notify a law enforcement officer and complete the report forms prescribed. (Ord. 2018-03, S6, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S6, 2017)

6.32.070 Insurance Required. Any person operating an off-road vehicle on a Town of Holland roadway shall have liability insurance specifically for such off-road vehicle in accordance with the minimum insurance required for the operation of other motor vehicles on public highways. (Ord. 2018-03, S7, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S7, 2017)

6.32.080 Proof of License/Registration. Any operator of an off-road vehicle shall carry in his or her possession any operator's license and registration required under I.C. 14-16-1 and the certificate of insurance required under this chapter and by Indiana Law for the off-road vehicle being operated. (Ord. 2018-03, S8, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S8, 2017)

6.32.090 Damage or Disturbance. No person shall operate an off-road vehicle on roads within the corporate municipal boundaries of the Town of Holland in such a manner which causes damage to the roadway or disturbs the surface of the roadway. Any violator of this Section, in addition to such penalties imposed under the statute set forth in Section 6.32.110 below, shall be responsible for all costs of repair of such damage or disturbance. (Ord. 2018-03, S9, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S9, 2017)

6.32.100 Emergency Prohibition. Any law enforcement officer may prohibit the operation of an off-road vehicle on a road within the municipal boundaries of the Town of Holland during emergencies. (Ord. 2018-03, S10, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S10, 2017)

6.32.110 Violation. A person who operates an off-road vehicle in violation of this chapter shall be subject to imposition of the same judgment prescribed for a Class C Infraction as set out in I.C 34-28-5-4, unless such violation is otherwise designated by a State statute or a rule or regulation promulgated by a State agency. (Ord. 2018-03, S11, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S11, 2017)

6.32.120 Law Enforcement Officers. All law enforcement officers in this state shall have the power and it shall be their duty to enforce the provisions of this chapter unless otherwise prevented by State statutes regarding the enforcement of State laws. All expenses related to the improvement and transportation of any off-road vehicle used in violation of this chapter and impounded by a law enforcement officer shall be paid by the owner of such vehicle prior to the release thereof. (Ord. 2018-03, S12, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S12, 2017)

6.32.130 Repeal of Ordinances. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed. (Ord. 2018-03, S13, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S13, 2017)

6.32.140 Severability. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase in this Chapter is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of this Chapter shall not be affected by such declaration and shall remain in full force and effect. (Ord. 2018-03, S14, Nov. 7, 2018) (Ord. unnumbered, S14, 2017)

Chapter 6.40

ONE-WAY STREETS

- 6.40.010** **Special One-Way Traffic Street**
- 6.40.200** **Erection of appropriate signs**

6.40.010 Special One-Way Traffic Street. Between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday of each week, vehicular traffic traveling on Second Street between its intersection with Iowa Street and Meridian Street in the Town of Holland, Indiana, shall be restricted to traveling only in a north direction on said Street. At all other times, vehicular traffic traveling on Second Street between its intersection with Iowa Street and Meridian Street in the Town of Holland, Indiana shall be open for two way traffic running north and south. (Ord. 1-99, S6.4.04, Feb. 22, 1999)

6.40.200 Erection of appropriate signs. The Holland Town Council hereby directs that appropriate signs be erected at appropriate locations at the above intersections so as to clearly identify the times and directions of permitted traffic flow on the above described portion of Second Street within the corporate limits of the Town of Holland, Indiana. (Ord. 1-99, Feb. 22, 1999)

6.50.010 Applicability. For purposes of this Chapter, “truck” shall mean any vehicle designed or operated for the transportation of property whose body weight or combined body and load weight exceeds ten (10) tons. (Ord. 6.50, S6.50.010, 2022) (Ord. 6.50, S6.50.010, 2017)

6.50.020 Truck Weight Limits and Restrictions.

- (1) A person shall only drive a “truck” on the specific public ways as determined by the Holland Town Board.
- (2) Public ways to which this section refers shall be listed in the “Truck Travel Schedule,” attached hereto as Table “1” – Section 6.50.060 and updated annually.
- (3) The Holland Town Board shall cause to be posted certain signs and markings on the public streets identified in the below described Schedule, clearly indicating thereon the restrictions imposed by this section.
- (4) The Restrictions in this Chapter 6.50 et. seq. shall not prohibit the operation of:
 - A. Trucks upon any street where necessary to conduct business at a destination point, provided streets upon which such traffic is permitted are used until reaching the intersection nearest the destination point;
 - B. Emergency vehicles upon any street in the Town;
 - C. Trucks owned or operated by the Town, public utilities, or any contractor or material man, while engaged in the repair, maintenance, or construction of streets, street improvements, or street utilities within the Town;

- D. Trucks upon any officially established detour where such trucks could lawfully be operated upon the street for which the detour is established;
 - E. Local service vehicles owned or operated by the Town of Holland including, but not limited to, school buses, passenger buses and trash trucks and residential delivery trucks.
- (5) Trucks subject to this chapter are also subject to the requirements and responsibilities of Title 9 (Motor Vehicles) of the Indiana Code. (Ord. 6.50, S6.50.020, 2022) (Ord. 6.50, S6.50.020, 2017)

6.50.030 Truck Traffic in the Town.

- (1) Trucks originating from outside the Town shall be subject to the following:
- A. One Inside Destination Point. All trucks entering the Town for one (1) destination point within the Town shall proceed only over unrestricted streets and shall enter onto and use restricted streets only at the intersection with the street nearest to the destination point. Upon leaving the destination point, such truck shall return to the unrestricted street by the shortest route and shall remain on unrestricted streets until outside of the Town.
 - B. Multiple Inside Destination Points. All trucks entering the Town for multiple destination points shall proceed only over unrestricted streets and shall enter onto and use restricted streets only at the intersection with the street nearest to the first destination point. Upon leaving the first destination point, a truck shall proceed to other destination points by the shortest direction and shall use unrestricted streets whenever reasonably practicable between destinations. Upon leaving the last destination point, a truck shall return to the unrestricted streets by the shortest route and shall remain on unrestricted streets until outside of the Town.
- (2) Trucks originating from inside the Town shall be subject to the following:
- A. Outside Destination Point. All trucks on a trip originating in the Town, and traveling to a destination point outside the Town, shall proceed by the shortest direction to an unrestricted street and shall remain on such an unrestricted street until outside of the Town.
 - B. Inside Destination Points. All trucks on a trip(s) originating in the Town, and traveling to destination points within the Town, shall proceed only over unrestricted streets and shall enter onto and use restricted streets only at the intersection with the street nearest to the first destination point. Upon leaving the first destination point, a truck

shall proceed to other destination points by the shortest direction and shall travel on unrestricted streets whenever reasonably practicable between destinations. Upon leaving the last destination point, a truck shall return to an unrestricted street by the shortest permissible route. (Ord. 6.50, S6.50.030, 2022) (Ord. 6.50, S6.50.030, 2017)

6.50.040 Enforcement.

- (1) The Holland Town Board shall cause all restricted streets to be clearly posted to give notice of the provisions of this Chapter.
- (2) No person shall be charged with violating the provisions of this chapter by reason of operating a truck upon a street where truck travel is prohibited unless appropriate signs are posted on the subject street. (Ord. 6.50, S6.50.040, 2022) (Ord. 6.50, S6.50.040, 2017)

6.50.050 Violation and Penalty.

- (1) It shall be the duty of the Holland Town Marshall to enforce the provisions of this title, pursuant to Indiana Code Section 9.08.020.
- (2) Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provision of this Chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00), except in those instances where some other fine is specifically provided. (Ord. 6.50, S6.50.050, 2022) (Ord. 6.50, S6.50.050, 2017)
