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## Chapter 15.04

### SPEED LIMIT

#### Sections:

**15.04.010 Maximum speed limit.** The maximum permissible speed limit for any and all vehicles on any and all streets within the corporate limits of the Town shall be 25 miles per hour. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any vehicle on any Town street in excess of 25 miles per hour. Provided however, it shall not be unlawful to operate a vehicle in excess of 25 miles per hour until suitable signs are on said streets. (Ord. No. 1, S6, Oct. 15, 1984) (Ord. unnumbered, S1, Aug. 8, 1924)

**15.04.020 Penalty for violation.** Any person who shall violate the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined in a sum not to exceed \$100.00. (Ord. 1, S3, Oct. 15, 1984) (Ord. unnumbered, Aug. 8, 1924)

**15.04.030 Enforcement.** This Ordinance shall be enforced by any law enforcement official of the State of Indiana, Pike County, and the Town Marshal or Deputy Marshal, pursuant to the provisions of IC 36-1-6. (Ord. 1, S5, Oct. 15, 1984)

## Chapter 15.05

### CUTOUT/MUFFLER PENALTY FOR VIOLATION

#### 15.05.010 Penalty of Violation

**15.05.010 Penalty of Violation.** Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Chapter, or who shall fail to comply with any of the provisions of said Chapters, may, in the discretion of the enforcement office, be issued an official warning. If an official warning is issued it shall be considered as affording the violator one opportunity to comply with this chapter's provisions. Failure to comply, shall upon a written finding of violation signed by the enforcement officer, result in an initial penalty of \$50.00 A second violation in any 12-month period is subject to a fine of \$150.00 and each subsequent violation is subject to a fine of \$250.00. Upon failure to comply with a written order or assessed penalty, the Town of Winslow shall be empowered to take all appropriate action necessary to enforce the written findings of the enforcement officer. **15.08.010 Parking violations.** Any person who operates a motor vehicle on the streets of Winslow, shall obey all parking violations such as:

- (1) No parking on yellow zones;
- (2) No parking in the wrong direction;
- (3) No blocking alleys;
- (4) No blocking sidewalks;
- (5) No parking within 15 ft. of fire hydrants;
- (6) No double parking; and
- (7) All other State parking violations not mentioned other than parking expiration on meters. (Ord. 1979-3-5, S1, Mar. 5, 1979)

**15.08.020 Penalty.** Any person who violates a provision of this Ordinance shall upon conviction be fined in a sum not to exceed Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00). Each operation in violation of this statute shall be a separate offense. (Ord. 1979-3-5, S2, Mar. 5, 1979)

**15.08.030 Expedited procedure.** Any person who violates a provision of this Ordinance may within seventy-two (72) hours pay the Clerk-Treasurer the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) and the payment shall be a complete discharge of his obligations under this Ordinance. I.C. 18-2-1-52 (Ord. 1979-3-5, S3, Mar. 5, 1979)

**15.08.040 Separability.** If any section, part of section, or part of this Ordinance, shall be declared unconstitutional, unlawful or void, it shall not affect the validity or force of any other section, part of section, or part of this Ordinance, not so declared to the unconstitutional, unlawful or void. (Ord. 1979-3-5, S4, Mar. 5, 1979)

**15.08.050 Ordinances or Resolution in conflict.** All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances, Resolutions or order or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, to the extent of such conflict, are hereby expressly rescinded and repealed. (Ord. 1979-3-5, S5, Mar. 5, 1979)

**15.08.060 Effective date.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law. Duly passed and adopted by the Town of Winslow on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1979. (Ord. 1979-3-5, S6, Mar. 5, 1979)

**15.12.010 Vehicle defined.** The word “vehicle” as used herein shall mean any device by which any person or property may be transported upon a street or highway. (Ord. 88-6, S1, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S1, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.020 Designation of parking meter zone.** That the following described areas in the Town of Winslow, Indiana, are hereby designated and established as parking meter zones for the hours and days as follows, to-wit:

- (1) During the hours of 8:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. on Monday through and including Saturday of each week, except all Sundays and holidays, the area and distance for parking meter zones shall be along and with Main Street in said Town from Lafayette Street to Union Street, and being both sides of said Main Street; on Washington Street between Mill Street and Cherry Street, and being both sides of said Washington Street; on Center Street between Mill Street and Cherry Street and being both sides of said Center Street. (Ord. 88-6, S2, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S2, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.030 Town to provide for installation and maintenance of meters.** The Board of Trustees of this Town shall provide for and direct the installation of meters, including curb or street marking lines, regulation and operation thereof, and shall cause said meters to be maintained in good workable condition. Meters shall be placed upon the curb next to individual parking places and meters shall be so constructed as to display a signal showing legal parking upon deposit therein of the proper coin, or coins, of the United States, as indicted by instructions on said meter, and for a period of time conforming to the parking limits of the Town of Winslow, Indiana, said signal to remain in evidence until expiration of

said parking period so designated, at which time a change of signal or some other mechanical operation shall indicate expiration of said parking period. (Ord. 88-6, S3, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S3, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.040 Authority to purchase meters.** The Town is hereby vested with the power and authority to enter into a contract for the purchase and installation of parking meters, and to provide payment therefor and the maintenance and policing thereof exclusively from the receipts obtained by the Town from their operation, and that said means of payment shall be in addition to any other purchasing powers heretofore granted the Town by its charter, or by the laws of the State of Indiana. (Ord. 88-6, S4, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S4, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.050 Parking rates.** When any vehicle shall be parked next to or near the curb covered by a parking meter, the owner or operator of said vehicle shall park within the area designated by the curb or street marking lines as indicated for parallel or diagonal parking, upon entering said parking space shall immediately deposit in said meter one or more coins of the United States as indicated by instructions on said meter. The parking rates shall be one cent for the first 12 minute period or fractional part thereof of parking, and an additional one cent for each consecutive 12 minute period or fractional part thereof of parking thereafter.

Said parking space may then be used by such vehicle during the legal parking limit provided by the Ordinances of the Town and said vehicle shall be considered as unlawfully parked if it remains in said space beyond the legal parking limit and/or when said parking meter properly displays a signal showing such illegal parking.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park any vehicle or to cause any vehicle to be parked contrary to the provisions of this Section.

It shall also be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to cause or permit or suffer any vehicle registered in his, her or its name to be parked contrary to the provisions of this Section. (Ord. 88-6, S5, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S5, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.060 Maximum parking time.** It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit, or cause to be deposited in a parking meter one or more coins for the purpose of extending the parking time beyond the maximum time fixed by any Ordinance of the Town of Winslow, Indiana. (Ord. 88-6, S6, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S6, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.070 Unlawful to deposit slug or substitute for a coin of the United States into meter.** It shall be unlawful to deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter, any slug, device or substitute for a coin of the United States. (Ord. 88-6, S7, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S7, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.080 Tampering with meter prohibited.** It shall be unlawful for any person to tamper with, deface, mar, scar, open, willfully break or destroy any parking meter. (Ord. 88-6, S8, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S8, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.090 Unlawfully parked vehicles.** It shall be the duty of police officers and/or their deputies so instructed to take the parking meter number and the state registration tag or license number and/or other means of vehicle identification for each vehicle unlawfully parked under the provisions of this Ordinance, and to also take the name of the person or persons, if any, occupying such unlawfully parked vehicles, and police officers or their

deputies shall make due complaint thereof in any lawful Court having competent jurisdiction. (Ord. 88-6, S9, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S9, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.100 Use of fees collected.** The fee required to be deposited in said meters is hereby levied as a police regulation and inspection fee to cover the cost of providing parking spaces, parking meters, and installation, and maintenance thereof, the cost of regulation and inspection, operation control and use of the parking meter spaces and zones created herein, for the regulation and control of traffic moving in and out of, and parking in, said parking spaces and zones so created, and for the cost of any resultant traffic administration expense. (Ord. 88-6, S10, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S10, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.110 Custodian of funds received.** The Clerk-Treasurer of the Town of Winslow, Indiana, is hereby designated the custodian of any and all funds received under levies hereby ordained and shall be deposited to the credit of the Town in a special fund from which disbursements shall be made only under the orders of the Board of Trustees and only for purposes provided by law. (Ord. 88-6, S11, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S11, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.120 Penalty for violation of Section 15.12.050.** Any person, firm or corporation, who shall violate any provision contained in Section 15.12.050 of this Chapter shall be issued a meter violation ticket and the person, firm or corporation issued a meter violation ticket may, in lieu of being charged for such violation in Justice of the Peace Court or Town Court or other court of competent jurisdiction for the penalties prescribed herein, pay the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) to the Clerk-Treasurer of the Town of Winslow within seventy-two (72) hours from and after the issuance of said meter violation ticket at such time and place or places as may be designated by the Board of Trustees. If said meter violation ticket is not duly paid within seventy-two (72) hours from and after the issuance thereof, such, person, firm or corporation shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not exceeding Five Dollars (\$5.00) and costs. (Ord. 88-6, S12, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S12, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.130 Penalty for violation of Section 15.12.070 or 15.12.080.** Any person who shall violate or assist in the violation of Section 15.12.070 or Section 15.12.080 of this Chapter shall, upon conviction of either offense be fined not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and costs. (Ord. 88-6, S13, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S13, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.140 Repeal of conflicting Ordinances.** Any and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with any of the terms or provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, but such repeal of part or parts of Ordinances shall not be deemed to repeal or invalidate any part or parts remaining which are not in conflict with this Ordinance. (Ord. 88-6, S14, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S14, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.150 Separability of provisions.** If any section, provision or part thereof in this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, then such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision or part thereof not so adjudged invalid or unconstitutional. (Ord. 88-6, S15, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S15, Jan. 31, 1953)

**15.12.160 Effective when.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the 24<sup>th</sup> day of September 1973. (Ord. 88-6, S16, Aug. 20, 1973) (Ord. 30, S16, Jan. 31, 1953)

## Chapter 15.15

### U-TURNS

**15.15.010 U-turns.** It shall be unlawful for the operator of any vehicle to make a U-turn with such vehicle, either to the right or left upon any part of the following streets in said Town of Winslow, Indiana, to-wit: First Main Street, except at and within the intersections of Main Street with other streets in the Town. Second all that part of Center Street between Main and Walnut Street. (Ord. unnumbered, S2, Nov. 6, 1933)

**15.15.020 Penalty for violation.** Whoever violates Section 15.15.010 of this Chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall pay a penalty therefor of not less than \$1.00, nor more than \$10.00. (Ord. unnumbered, S3, Nov. 6, 1933)

#### **15.20.010 One-way streets designated.**

- (1) Porter Street, from its intersection with Bluff Street, to its intersection with East Street in Winslow, is hereby designated to be a one-way traffic street, in the westerly direction. (Ord. 2001-2, SI, Aug. 27, 2001) (Ord. 2000-4, SI, Aug. 28, 2000) (Ord. 1977-11-21, S1, Nov. 21, 1977)

**15.20.020 Proper signage.** The Town of Winslow shall erect and maintain proper signs, and any other traffic signals deemed necessary, to signal to the general public that traffic must comply with the one-way travel provisions of this Ordinance (Chapter). (Ord. 2001-2, SII, Aug. 27, 2001) (Ord. 2000-4, SII, Aug. 28, 2000)

**15.20.030 Enforcement.** The Town Marshal and the Deputy Town Marshal of Town of Winslow shall enforce this Ordinance and shall report violations to the Ordinance Violations Bureau of the Town of Winslow. (Ord. 2001-2, SIII, Aug. 27, 2001) (Ord. 2000-4, SIII, Aug. 28, 2000)

**15.20.040 Penalty.** The penalty for each violation of this Ordinance shall be a fine in the sum of \$25.00, which sum shall be collected as provided in Winslow Town Ordinance No. 1995-3, providing for the creation of an Ordinance Violations Bureau. (Ord. 2001-2, SIV, Aug. 27, 2001) (Ord. 2000-4, SIV, Aug. 28, 2000) (Ord. 1977-11-21, S2, S3, Nov. 21, 1977)

**15.20.050 Conflicts.** Any Winslow Town Ordinance in conflict with this Ordinance, is hereby repealed, to the extent of the conflict. (Ord. 2001-2, SV, Aug. 27, 2001) (Ord. 2000-4, SV, Aug. 28, 2000)

**15.20.060 Effective.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect, from and after its publication, as provided by law.

**15.24.010 Purpose.** To reduce excessive speeds on residential streets to ensure the safety of pedestrians, cyclists, and animals. There is increasing disregard for signed restrictions such as speed limit and stop signs. The installation of speed humps has been shown to slow traffic, but it is not a guarantee that the street is a safe place for children to play. Streets exist primarily for the passage of motor vehicles, hence residents, both adults and children, should exercise care when in the roadway. (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.24.020 Definition of speed humps.** A speed hump is a traffic calming device used to reduce speeds on residential streets. Typically 3-4 inches high and spanning the width of the road, they may be rounded or flat topped sections of rubber, asphalt or concrete. (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.24.030 Installation criteria.** Speed humps will only be installed when the following conditions are met:

- (1) There is a demonstrated traffic, safety or speeding problem and other measures will not address the problem.
- (2) The location is a two lane residential street.
- (3) The installation has been reviewed and approved by the Winslow Town Council. (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.24.040 General Conditions.** The following general conditions will be considered before approving the installation of speed humps.

- (1) A motorist should have adequate sight distance to react to speed humps.

- (2) Speed humps will be placed only over clear, unencumbered paving (no manholes, etc.)
- (3) The speed hump will be located downstream from a drainage inlet if at all possible.
- (4) The speed hump should be placed near existing lighting if possible.
- (5) The speed hump will not be placed in front of a driveway.
- (6) The speed hump will not be placed in an intersection.
- (7) Speed humps will only be placed on streets where traffic speeds are intended to be low.
- (8) Speed humps will not be placed on streets that are defined or used as primary emergency vehicle access routes; those routes used by emergency vehicles to cross large parts of the community or on paths logically used to service large numbers of potential destinations.
- (9) Speed humps should not be placed on streets with downgrades exceeding 5% approaching the speed hump side. (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.24.050 Signage.** All speed humps will have signage in compliance with the Indiana Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.24.060 Neighborhood support.**

- (1) The roadway segment on which the speed hump is to be placed must have neighborhood support. One vote per property owner is allowed.
- (2) 75% of the property owners directly affected by the speed hump must approve its placement. Generally, the “directly affected” area will consist of homes that do not have the option of avoiding the proposed device. (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.24.070 Installation process.**

- (1) The initial request for installation of a speed hump must originate from a resident “applicant” of a property on the candidate street.
- (2) The request must be presented in writing to the Winslow Town Council with documentation of neighborhood acceptance.
- (3) The request will be evaluated to determine if all conditions are met.
- (4) In the event an applicant’s request is denied, a repeat application may be made in one year’s time. (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.24.080 Removal or modification of speed humps.** If in the future, residents desire the removal of a speed hump, removal will only be considered after the receipt of a petition from a substantial majority (75% or more) asking for the removal, along with sufficient funds (approximately \$1,000.00 per hump).

The Town of Winslow may remove any or all of the speed humps at any time for safety reasons at no cost to the abutting property owners.

The Town of Winslow reserves the right to withdraw and/or amend this policy at any time. (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.24.090 Construction of Clause Headings.** The clause headings appearing herein have been provided for convenience and reference and do not purport and shall not be deemed to define, limit or extend the scope of intent of the clause to which they appertain. (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.24.100 Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances.** The provisions of all other Town ordinances in conflict with the provisions hereof, if any, are of no further force or effect and are hereby repealed. (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.24.110 Severability.** If any part of the Chapter shall be held invalid, such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remainder of the Chapter. (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.24.120 Duration and Effective Date.** The provisions of this Chapter shall become and remain in full force, following the date of its passage and adoption upon its signature by the Town's executive in the manner prescribed by I.C. 36-5-2-10(A). (Ord. 2020-06, Aug. 10, 2020)

**15.26.010 Stop signs designated.** The attached hereto, made a part hereof, incorporated fully herein as if set out in full, and or purposes of identification is marked Exhibit A, is a list of the “Stop Signs” at traffic intersections and other appropriate places within the corporate limits of the Town of Winslow at which all vehicles of every kind, character, and description must come to a complete stop. (Ord. 02-05, S1, May 13, 2002) (Ord. 1, S1, Oct. 15, 1984)

**15.26.020 Purpose of stop sign control.** The purpose of this Ordinance (Chapter) is to promote the safe and orderly flow of traffic on the public alleys and streets of the Town of Winslow for the proper and safe coming and going of the public. From time to time, this Ordinance may be amended to include additional locations for the erection of “Stop Signs” to better regulate the safe flow of traffic on and over the public streets and alleys of the Town, and any addition or deletions shall be added to or deleted from Exhibit A referred to above; provided however, that it shall not be unlawful for any person operating any vehicle to fail to stop at any such “Stop Sign” location until a suitable sign is erected at such location. (Ord. 1, S2, Oct. 15, 1984)

**15.26.030 Penalty for violation.** Any person who shall violate the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined in a sum not to exceed \$100.00. (Ord. 1, S3, Oct. 15, 1984)

**15.26.040 Full and complete stop.** It shall be unlawful for any person operating a vehicle to fail to come to a full and complete stop or halt at any such erected “Stop Sign”. (Ord. 1, S4, Oct. 15, 1984)

**15.26.050 Enforcement.** This Ordinance shall be enforced by any law enforcement official of the State of Indiana, Pike County, and the Town Marshal or Deputy Marshal pursuant to the provisions of IC 36-1-6. (Ord. 1, S5, Oct. 15, 1984)

## Chapter 15.30

### UTILITY TASK VEHICLES ON TOWN STREETS

**15.30.010 Definitions.** For the purpose of this chapter the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning:

- (1) Utility Task Vehicle – A vehicle defined as a small 2-4 person four-wheel drive off-road vehicle having a side-by-side seating arrangement.
- (2) Driver’s License – A valid license to operate a motor vehicle issued by the State of Indiana. (Ord. 2021-10, Sept. 27, 2021)

**15.30.020 Operator.** Only persons over sixteen (16) years of age and holding a valid driver’s license may operate a utility task vehicle. (Ord. 2021-10, Sept. 27, 2021)

**15.30.030 Times of Operation.** Utility task vehicles shall not be operated on town streets during one-half hour after sunset to one-half before sunrise, unless the utility task vehicle is in compliance with Indiana Code 14-16-1-21 or as it may be amended or replaced. (Ord. 2021-10, Sept. 27, 2021)

**15.30.040 Places of Operation.** Utility task vehicles may be operated on town streets which have a posted speed limit of 35 MPH or less or on the public right-of-way adjacent to the traveled part of the public highway if there is sufficient width to operate at a reasonable distance off and away from the traveled part and in a manner so as not to endanger life or property. Utility task vehicles may not be operated on sidewalks. (Ord. 2021-10, Sept. 27, 2021)

**15.30.050 Occupants.** The number of occupants in a utility task vehicle shall be limited to the number of persons for whom factory seating is installed and provided for on the vehicle. The operator and all occupants shall be seated in the vehicle and no part of the body of the operator or occupant shall extend outside the perimeter of the vehicle while the vehicle is being operated. (Ord. 2021-10, Sept. 27, 2021)

**15.30.060 Traffic Rules.** The operator of the utility task vehicle shall comply with all traffic rules and regulations adopted by the State of Indiana and the Town of Winslow which govern the operations of motor vehicles and off-road vehicles including IC 14-16-1 et seq. (Ord. 2021-10, Sept. 27, 2021)

## Chapter 15.35

### GOLF CARTS ON TOWN STREETS

**15.35.010 Definitions.** For the purposes of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning:

- (1) **Golf cart** is hereby defined as a four-wheeled motor vehicle originally and specifically designed and intended to transport one or more individuals and golf clubs for the purposes of playing the game of golf on a golf course.
- (2) **Roadways** means that portion of a town highway, road, street, alley or right of way improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular travel or parking.
- (3) **Operate** means to exercise any control over the function or movement of a golf cart.
- (4) **Driver's license** means a valid license to operate a motor vehicle issued by the State of Indiana or any other state. (Ord. 2022-05, May 9, 2022)

**15.35.020 Authorization and Requirements of Operation.** Golf carts are hereby authorized to be operated on all streets and alleys under the jurisdiction of the Town of Winslow, with exception of any highway designated as a part of the State highway system, other than to cross such State highway as they intersect with local streets under the jurisdiction of the Town. Each owner/operator of a golf cart, pursuant to the terms of this chapter, must comply with the following requirements.

- (1) Golf cart is subject to all traffic regulations applicable to the operation of motor vehicles.
- (2) Any golf cart operated on any public road herein shall carry no more passengers than actual seating provided by the vehicle manufacturer, and no more than four passengers other than the driver. The operator and all occupants shall be seated in the golf cart and no part of the body of the occupants shall extend outside the perimeter of the golf cart while the golf cart is in motion.
- (3) Only persons over sixteen (16) years of age and holding a valid driver's license may operate a golf cart.
- (4) Golf carts shall not be operated on town streets during one-half after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise unless the golf cart is equipped with two operating headlights (one on each side of the front of the golf cart) and two

operating tail lights with brake lights (one on each side of the rear of the golf cart) which are visible from a distance of five hundred (500) feet. (Ord. 2022-05, May 9, 2022)

**15.35.030 Required Equipment.** The following equipment is required on any golf cart during operation on any roadway.

- (1) The slow moving vehicle emblem provided for the state statute, properly mounted to the rear of the golf cart pursuant to state regulations.
- (2) A rear view mirror, properly mounted on the golf cart so as to reflect to the operator a view of the street for a distance of at least two hundred (200) feet to the rear of the golf cart.
- (3) A red or orange safety flag properly mounted five feet above the rear bumper of the vehicle. (Ord. 2022-05, May 9, 2022)

**15.35.040 Fines and Penalties.** In addition to penalties provided by law for violation of traffic laws and regulations, any person who violates this Chapter shall be fined in the sum of \$25.00 for the first offense, \$50.00 for the second offense, and \$100.00 for each subsequent offense. Such fines shall be deposited in the General Fund of the Town of Winslow. (Ord. 2022-05, May 9, 2022)

**15.35.050 Exemptions.** This chapter does not apply to golf carts that are being operated in special events of limited duration that is conducted according to a prearranged schedule and which has been approved or sanctioned by the Town (such as parades and festivals). (Ord. 2022-05, May 9, 2022)

**15.35.060 Appeal.** An appeal of a decision or a citation issued by the Winslow Town Marshal may be made to the Winslow Town Council within 30 days of the initial citation or decision. (Ord. 2022-05, May 9, 2022)

## Chapter 15.40

### OFF-ROAD VEHICLES ON TOWN STREETS

**15.40.010 Compliance with State Statute.** Nothing in this Section modifies, alters or changes the restrictions or requirements as set forth in IC 14-16-1. (Ord. 2022-07, June 27, 2022)

**15.40.020 Registration and Insurance.** Any operator of an off-road vehicle shall carry on his or her person any registration required under IC 14-16-1 for the off-road vehicle being operated. (Ord. 2022-07, June 27, 2022)

#### **15.40.030 Definitions.**

- (1) An **“off-road vehicle”** (ORV) as defined by the Indiana Department of Natural Resources Law Enforcement Division includes the following:
  - A. an ATV,
  - B. Four Wheeler and Three Wheeler,
  - C. Quad,
  - D. Dirt Bike,
  - E. UTV, and
  - F. Side by Side
- (2) **“Operator”** means an individual who operates or is in actual physical control of an off-road vehicle.
- (3) **“Operate”** means to ride in or on, and be in actual physical control of the operation of an off-road vehicle.
- (4) **“Owner”** means a person, other than a lien holder, who has the property in or title to, and is entitled to the use or possession of an off-road vehicle. (Ord. 2022-07, June 27, 2022)

**15.40.040 Designated areas.**

- (1) Off-road vehicles may be operated on all Town streets and Town parking lots except that off-road vehicles may not be operated on State Road 61 (Main Street) except as follows:
  - A. An off-road vehicle may be operated on the public right-of-way adjacent to the traveled part of the public highway if there is sufficient width to operate at a reasonable distance off and away from the traveled part and in a manner so as not to endanger life or property.
  - B. An off-road vehicle may cross a public highway at right angles for the purpose of getting from one (1) area to another when the operation can be done safely. The operator shall bring the vehicle to a complete stop before proceeding across a public highway and shall yield the right-of-way to all traffic.
  - C. An off-road vehicle may be operated on a public highway for a special event of limited duration conducted according to a prearranged schedule with permission from the Town such as for festivals, parades, etc. (Ord. 2022-07, June 27, 2022)

**15.40.050 Restrictions on use.** An individual shall not operate an off-road vehicle on Town streets under any of the following conditions.

- (1) Without a valid driver's license.
- (2) At a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper or in a manner that unnecessarily endangers the person or property of another.
- (3) Under the influence of an alcoholic beverage, unlawfully under the influence of a narcotic or other habit forming or dangerous depressant or stimulant drug.
- (4) During the hours from thirty (30) minutes after sunset to thirty (30) minutes before sunrise without a lighted headlight and a lighted taillight.
- (5) Within one hundred (100) feet of a dwelling between midnight and 6:00 am.
- (6) Unless the vehicle is equipped with a muffler in good working order and in constant operation to prevent excessive or unusual noise and annoying smoke.
- (7) Unless the vehicle has adequate brakes capable of producing deceleration at fourteen (14) feet a second on level ground at a speed of twenty (20) miles per hour.
- (8) On any property without the consent of the landowner or tenant.
- (9) On or across a cemetery or burial ground.
- (10) On the sports fields or playgrounds except for the purpose of servicing the area.
- (11) On sidewalks, walkways, pathways or trails designed for use by pedestrians.

- (12) On a railroad track or railroad right-of-way, except railroad personnel in the performance of duties.
- (13) With the intent to hunt, pursue, worry or kill a wild or domestic animal. (Ord. 2022-07, June 27, 2022)

**15.40.060 Other laws and regulations.** Nothing in this Section modifies, alters or changes the requirements of the operation of vehicles on public roadways in Indiana, and all operators of off-road vehicles must obey and follow all rules and regulation applicable to the operation of vehicles on Indiana roadways. (Ord. 2022-07, June 27, 2022)

**15.40.070 Disturbance of roadway.** No person shall operate an off-road vehicle on Winslow town streets in such a manner which causes damage to the roadway or highway or disturbs the surface of the roadway or highway. Any violator of this Section, in addition to such penalties set forth below, shall be responsible for all costs of repair of such damage or disturbance. (Ord. 2022-07, June 27, 2022)

**15.40.080 Penalties and enforcement.**

- (1) Any individual who violates any of the provisions of this Section or an owner whose off-road vehicle has been operated in violation of this Section shall be subject to the following fines and/or penalties:
  - A. First offense \$ 25.00
  - B. Second offense \$ 100.00
  - C. Third offense \$ 200.00
- (2) The Town may seek injunctive relief from a court to address a repeat offender.
- (3) Any fine provided for in this Section shall be paid within ten (10) days of the issuance of the citation to the Town's Ordinance Violations Clerk at the Town Hall, who shall issue a receipt in duplicate to the payer.
- (4) The Town may collect, in addition to any fines owed to the Town, all costs and attorney fees incurred to enforce this Section. (Ord. 2022-07, June 27, 2022)
